A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FINANCIAL ABUSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Reported instances of financial abuse of elders
- 2 have become increasingly widespread throughout the United
- 3 States. As one means by which to attempt to curtail this
- 4 disturbing trend, it is the intent of the legislature to impose
- 5 on financial institutions a duty to promptly report suspected
- 6 incidents of financial abuse to local law enforcement agencies
- 7 or the department of human services, so that those agencies can
- 8 determine whether further investigation or other action is
- 9 warranted.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 412, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "§412: Mandatory reporting of suspected financial abuse
- 14 of an elder. (a) A financial institution shall report
- 15 suspected financial abuse that is directed towards, targets, or
- 16 is committed against an elder to the department of human
- 17 services if:

19	(b)	Suspe	ected financial abuse shall be reported
20	immediatel	y to	the department by telephone and by written report
21	sent within five business days.		

1	(c) Upon notification by a financial institution of			
2	suspected financial abuse, the department, in a timely manner,			
3	shall determine whether the department has jurisdiction over the			
4	elder involved; and if not, shall notify the financial			
5	institution, which shall then notify the proper local law			
6	enforcement agency immediately by telephone and forward the			
7	written report to the agency within three business days. A			
8	financial institution shall not be liable for failing to report			
9	suspected financial abuse to a local law enforcement agency in			
10	cases in which the department fails to notify the institution of			
11	the department's lack of jurisdiction.			
12	(d) Notwithstanding any other state law to the contrary,			
13	including but not limited to laws concerning confidentiality,			
14	any person, including the financial institution, who:			
15	(1) Participates in the making of a report pursuant to			
16	this section; and			
17	(2) Believes, in good faith, that the action is warranted			
18	by facts known to that person,			
19	shall have immunity from any liability, civil or criminal, that			
20	might be otherwise incurred or imposed by or as a result of the			

making of the report. Any person making the report shall have

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- 1 the same immunity with respect to participation in any judicial
- 2 proceeding resulting from the report.
- 3 (e) For the purposes of this section:
- 4 "Department" means the department of human services.
- 5 "Elder" means a person who is sixty-two years of age or
- 6 older.
- 7 "Financial abuse" means financial abuse or economic
- 8 exploitation."
- 9 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
