A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR NATURAL DISASTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for 1 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of 2 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii. 3 SECTION 2. The purpose of this Act is to make an emergency 4 appropriation for emergency relief operations in the counties of 5 Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and the city and county of Honolulu as a 6 result of the October 15, 2006, Kiholo Bay earthquake disaster 7 8 to: (1) Cover the costs of statewide response and recovery 9 efforts to repair damaged homes, public buildings, 10 11 transportation infrastructure, utilities, irrigation systems in Waimea, lower Hamakua, and North Kohala, 12

- hospitals, and nursing homes, especially on theislands of Hawaii and Maui;
- 15 (2) Cover the required twenty-five per cent cost share for
 16 the Federal Emergency Management Agency's public

1		Emergency Assistance Act, and for the Natural
2		Resources Conservation Service's emergency watershed
3		protection program;
4	(3)	Upgrade state and county warning systems by providing
5		emergency generators to selected critical facilities
6		such as radio and television stations to ensure
7		continuity of operations in informing the general
8		public of potential immediate risks;
9	(4)	Hire consultants to:
10		(A) Investigate and survey alternate sources of
11		irrigation water for Hawaii island; and
12		(B) Develop and coordinate plans for public and
13		private partnerships to improve and to protect
14		sources and distribution of irrigation water on
15		Hawaii island; and
16	(5)	Provide financial assistance to critical facilities
17		such as public schools, hospitals, and nursing
18		facilities for structural and non-structural
19		mitigation projects.
20	The	legislature finds and declares the appropriations under
21	this Act	are in the public interest and ensures public health,
22	safety, a	nd general welfare of the State.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$900,000, or so much
 thereof as may be necessary, for fiscal year 2006-2007, to cover
 operational expenses associated with earthquake disaster
 recovery efforts, including but not limited to national guard
 personnel on state active duty and helicopter operating
 expenses.

8 The sum shall also cover operational expenses associated 9 with the October 15, 2006, Kiholo Bay earthquake disaster 10 recovery efforts in the counties of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and the 11 city and county of Honolulu pursuant to section 2 of this Act.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of13 defense for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the emergency and 14 budget reserve fund, established pursuant to section 328L-3, 15 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the sum of \$24,000,000, or so much 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2006-2007, for 17 earthquake disaster recovery projects to include the twenty-five 18 per cent non-federal cost share for all earthquake disaster 19 recovery projects made eligible under the Federal Emergency 20 Management Agency's public assistance program; provided that any 21 reimbursements made to the State by the Federal Emergency 22

2	budget re	eserve fund. The appropriation will provide for the
3	emergency	y repair of the Kohala ditch in North Kohala, including

10	authorize	ed by this Act shall submit reports to the legislature
11	no later	than January 15, 2008. The information contained in

15		basis; and

1	(D) For funds not authorized by this Act but			
2	nevertheless used by any department or agency for			
3	the purposes of this Act:			
4	(i) The source of those funds, by specific			
5	program;			
6	(ii) The impact to the programs originally funded			
7	by those funds; and			
8	(iii) The need for any emergency appropriations			
9	that resulted from the diversion of those			
10	funds.			
11	SECTION 6. Any provision of the Act to the contrary			
12	notwithstanding, the appropriations under this Act shall not			
13	lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriations			
14	were made. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of the			
15	appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business on			
16	June 30, 2008, shall lapse.			
17	SECTION 7. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of			
18	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and			
19	37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined			
20	that the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year			
21	2006-2007 (established at \$5,357,987,705 on November 8, 2006)			
22	has already been exceeded by \$90,137,694 or 1.68 per cent. The

appropriations contained in section 3 will cause the state 1 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2006-2007 to be 2 exceeded by an additional \$900,000, or an additional 0.017 per 3 The calculation contained in the foregoing sentence 4 cent. relates only to the amount of general funds appropriated in this 5 Act for fiscal year 2006-2007. The reasons for exceeding the 6 general fund expenditure ceiling are that the appropriations 7 made in section 3 are necessary to serve the public interest and 8 to meet the needs provided for by section 3. 9 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 10
