A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the homeless and
3	affordable housing crises continue to be two of the State's most
4	significant and challenging social problems.
5	The most recent estimate of the total number of homeless
6	persons in the State is six thousand twenty-nine on any given
7	day. In addition, the Hawaii Homeless Point-in-Time Study of
8	2003 found that over four thousand of these homeless persons are
9	unsheltered. This is indicative of the limited shelter space
10	available in the State.
11	Also troubling is the fact that a staggering thirty-seven
12	per cent of the unsheltered homeless are individuals of Hawaiian
13	or part-Hawaiian ancestry. Equally troubling is the fact that
14	on any given day, there are eight hundred thirty-eight homeless
15	children in the State. None of these numbers reflect the number
16	of people who are considered hidden homeless or those who are
17	at-risk of homelessness.
18	Housing, in general, is a critical issue for many residents
19	in Hawaii, where the cost of homeownership and rentals are

- 1 increasing. The prospect of making high mortgage payments and
- 2 saving enough money for the downpayment and closing costs needed
- 3 to buy a home at current market prices is a formidable
- 4 challenge. Even higher income families must often seek help
- 5 from relatives to overcome this obstacle. More needs to be done
- 6 to increase the inventory of, and ensure that residents have
- 7 access to, affordable housing, as well.
- 8 The legislature recognizes that meaningful solutions to
- 9 Hawaii's housing and homeless problems must be found.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 11 (1) Provide funding for various homeless shelters and 12 transitional housing programs and services;
 - (2) Require the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to create an affordable housing inventory registry and to report annually to the legislature on expenditures from the rental housing trust fund;
 - (3) Extend the sunset date for the allocation of a percentage of conveyance tax revenues to the rental housing trust fund to June 30, 2012;
- (4) Exempt special purpose revenue bonds that are issuedto assist in the development of low- and

1	moderate-income housing projects from the procurement
2	code; and
3	(5) Provide funding for various affordable and public
4	housing programs.
5	PART II. THE HOMELESS
6	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
8	much thereof as may be necessary for the fiscal year 2007-2008
9	for homeless facilities, emergency shelters, and transitional
10	shelters, as defined by section 356D-121, Hawaii Revised
11	Statutes.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
13	housing authority for the purposes of this section.
14	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and
17	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
18	year 2008-2009 to provider agencies, as defined by section 356D-
19	121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, who offer outreach or support
20	services, or both, to unsheltered homeless, at risk homeless,
21	and those residing in homeless facilities, including emergency
22	shelters and transitional shelters.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of human services for the purposes of this section.
- 3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and
- 6 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 7 year 2008-2009, to provide matching funds for the United States
- 8 Department of Housing and Urban Development homeless assistance
- 9 program, including shelter plus care and other supportive
- 10 housing programs.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 12 housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of
- 13 this Act.
- 14 PART III. AFFORDABLE AND PUBLIC HOUSING
- 15 SECTION 5. Section 39A-282, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- "[{]§39A-282[}] Department powers in the development of
- 18 low- and moderate-income housing. (In addition to powers that
- 19 it may now have, the] (a) The department shall have all powers
- 20 necessary or convenient to accomplish the purposes of this part.
- 21 The powers of the department shall include [but are not limited
- 22 to the following]:

- 5 SECTION 6. Section 201H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "[+] §201H-6[+] Housing advocacy and information system.
- 8 (a) The corporation, with the assistance of other agencies of
- 9 the State and counties with related responsibilities, shall
- 10 develop and maintain a housing advocacy and information system
- 11 to aid the corporation in meeting the needs and demands of
- 12 housing consumers.
- (b) In establishing and maintaining the housing advocacy
- 14 and information system, the corporation shall conduct market
- 15 studies, engage in community outreach, and solicit
- 16 recommendations from, and statistics and research developed by,
- 17 agencies of the United States, the State, the counties, private
- 18 research organizations, nonprofit community groups, trade
- 19 associations, including those of the construction and real
- 20 estate industries, departments, individuals at the University of
- 21 Hawaii, and housing consumers.

1	(c) The corporation shall analyze the information received
2	and make recommendations to the appropriate agencies and
3	developers.
4	(d) The corporation, through the housing advocacy and
5	information system, shall act as a clearinghouse for information
6	relating to housing conditions, needs, supply, demand,
7	characteristics, developments, trends in federal housing
8	programs, and housing laws, ordinances, rules, and regulations.
9	(e) The housing advocacy and information system may be
10	used by housing researchers, planners, administrators, and
11	developers and shall be coordinated with other housing research
12	efforts. The corporation shall maintain a current supply of
13	information, including means to gather new information through
14	surveys, contracted research, and investigations.
15	(f) The corporation, through the housing advocacy and
16	information system, shall develop and maintain an affordable
17	housing inventory registry to identify:
18	(1) Affordable housing projects developed by the
19	corporation utilizing moneys in the rental housing
20	trust fund or the dwelling unit revolving fund;

(2) State and federal public housing projects identified

by the Hawaii public housing authority;

1	(3) United States Department of Housing and Urban
2	Development Region 9 federally supported and privately
3	managed housing projects; and
4	(4) State and county lands that may be developed for
5	affordable housing, as defined in section 201H-57(b)."
6	SECTION 7. Act 100, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is
7	amended by amending section 30 to read as follows:
8	"SECTION 30. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006;
9	provided that on June 30, $[2007,]$ 2012, section 21 shall be
10	repealed and section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
11	reenacted in the form in which it read on the day before the
12	approval of this Act."
13	SECTION 8. Section 247-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	"§247-7 Disposition of taxes. All taxes collected each
16	fiscal year under this chapter shall be paid into the state
17	treasury to the credit of the general fund of the State, to be
18	used and expended for the purposes for which the general fund
19	was created and exists by law; provided that of the taxes
20	collected each fiscal year:
21	(1) Ten per cent shall be paid into the land conservation
22	fund established pursuant to section 173A-5;

1 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 2 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and 3 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 4 5 year 2008-2009, to be deposited in the rental housing trust 6 fund. SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the rental 7 housing trust fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as 8 may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum or 9 10 so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the planning, development, and construction of affordable 11 12 housing in cooperation with private and nonprofit developers. The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii 13 housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of 14 15 this section. SECTION 11. The Hawaii housing finance and development 16 corporation shall submit a report to the legislature no later 17 than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2008 regular 18 session, and shall submit a report to the legislature no later 19 than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session 20 thereafter. The report shall include an accounting of the 21 expenditures made from the rental housing trust fund and the 22

- 2 with its plan to develop for-sale units and rental units.
- 3 SECTION 12. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 4 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum or so much thereof
- 6 as may be necessary the proceeds of which are appropriated for
- 7 fiscal year 2007-2008 to be deposited in the dwelling unit
- 8 revolving fund.
- 9 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the dwelling unit
- 10 revolving fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may
- 11 be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum or so
- 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for
- 13 the planning, development, and construction of four thousand
- 14 affordable housing units in cooperation with private developers.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 16 housing finance and development corporation for the purposes of
- 17 this section.
- 18 SECTION 14. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for
- 21 the repair and maintenance of existing federal and state public
- 22 housing buildings.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 2 housing authority for the purpose of this section.
- 3 SECTION 15. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 4 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum or so much thereof
- 6 as may be necessary the proceeds of which are appropriated for
- 7 fiscal year 2007-2008 for the purpose of capital improvement
- 8 projects.
- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii public
- 10 housing authority for the purpose of this section.
- 11 SECTION 16. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- 12 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum or so much thereof
- 14 as may be necessary the proceeds of which are appropriated for
- 15 fiscal year 2007-2008 for the repair and maintenance of
- 16 elevators in existing federal and state public housing
- 17 buildings.
- 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii
- 19 public housing authority for the purposes of this section.
- 20 PART IV.
- 21 SECTION 17. The appropriations made in sections 12, 15,
- 22 and 16 of this Act shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal

- 1 biennium for which the appropriation is made; provided that all
- 2 appropriations that are unencumbered as of June 30, 2010, shall
- 3 lapse as of that date.
- 4 SECTION 18. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 19. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007;
- 7 provided that section 7 of this Act shall take effect on
- 8 June 29, 2007.

Housing Omnibus Bill

Description:

Extends the sunset date for the allocation of conveyance tax revenues to the rental housing trust fund for five years and changes the allocation to sixty-five per cent; requires the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation to create an affordable housing inventory registry and to report annually on expenditures from the rental housing trust fund; exempts special purpose revenue bonds issued to assist in the development of low- and moderate-income housing projects from the procurement code; and appropriates funds for various homeless and housing programs and projects.
