A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The Senator Hiram L. Fong commission 1 established by the legislature through Act 117, Session Laws of 2 Hawaii 2005, found that Senator Fong's public service of over 3 thirty years was distinguished by his ability to bridge partisan 4 and ethnic lines. Senator Fong championed civil rights, labor 5 rights, and immigration reform. He helped pass the Little Wager 6 Act, which gave Hawaii's agricultural workers who were not 7 covered under the federal Wagner Act, the right to unionize. 8 Senator Fong was also a firm believer in the free market and the 9 10 virtues of personal responsibility and self-reliance. The commission also found that Senator Fong's legislative 11
- The commission also found that Senator Fong's legislative
 accomplishments were the result of collaboration and cooperation
 from his democratic colleagues, particularly Hawaii's other
 United States senator, Oren E. Long, and United States Senate
 majority leader, Lyndon Johnson. Federal legislation to
- 16 establish the East-West Center was introduced by Senator Oren E.

- 1 Long and its ultimate success is due in large part to his and
- 2 Senator Hiram L. Fong's leadership and collaboration.
- 3 The commission recommended that the legislature establish
- 4 the Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship at the University of
- 5 Hawaii. The commission also suggested that Senator Oren E. Long
- 6 be honored for his forty-one years of public service, which
- 7 included service as superintendent of public instruction for
- 8 twelve years, secretary of the territory of Hawaii, governor of
- 9 Hawaii, and United States Senator.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish two scholarship
- 11 programs--one in honor of Senator Hiram L. Fong and the other in
- 12 honor of Senator Oren E. Long--to be administered by the
- 13 University of Hawaii, with proceeds from endowment trusts that
- 14 shall receive initial funding by appropriations out of the
- 15 general revenues of the State.
- 16 The legislature finds and declares that the appropriations
- 17 under this Act are in the best interest of the public in helping
- 18 to provide public higher education assistance opportunities.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
- 21 designated and to read as follows:

9	(e) The scholarship program shall be funded with proceeds
10	from an endowment trust established with initial funding by an
11	appropriation out of the general revenues of the State and shall
12	be administered by the board of regents for the purposes of
13	supporting the Senator Oren E. Long scholarship program."
14	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the
17	University of Hawaii to establish an endowment trust with an
18	appropriate financial institution, the proceeds from which shall
19	fund the Senator Hiram L. Fong scholarship; provided that the
20	University of Hawaii shall administer the scholarship in
21	accordance with the report of November 17, 2005, submitted to
22	the legislature from the Senator Hiram L. Fong commission.
