A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. In 2001, the Hawaii educator loan program and
2	special fund were established to recruit college students to
3	become educators and to ensure that these graduates teach in our
4	public schools. The legislature finds that although the program
5	has proven to be successful, the State is still experiencing a
6	teacher shortage. In particular, hard-to-fill positions,
7	including special education, regular education shortage
8	categories, and teacher positions in rural areas have posed a
9	significant teacher recruitment and retention challenge for our
10	public schools.
11	The legislature also finds that a similar problem exists
12	with attracting and retaining educational assistants, especially
13	certified educational assistants, to work in schools located in
14	rural areas. Community colleges and adult community schools
15	offer educational assistant certification training programs, but
16	only in limited areas, where access may be a problem for those
17	who live in rural areas. Moreover, many educational assistants

- 1 who are already working part- or full-time in these communities 2 cannot afford the tuition costs at a community college. 3 The purpose of this Act is to establish educational 4 assistant loan and loan forgiveness programs to recruit and 5 retain qualified educational assistants to work in rural areas 6 and hard-to-fill positions in public schools throughout the 7 State. 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 10 11 "§302A- Educational assistant loan forgiveness program; special fund. (a) There is created the educational assistant 12 13 loan forgiveness program to be administered by the department in partnership with a financial institution whose operations are 14 15 principally conducted in Hawaii, for the purpose of providing 16 financial support to educational assistants who complete a 17 state-approved certification training program and agree to teach 18 in the Hawaii public school system at a school located in a 19 rural area, as determined by the department and for a period of time to be determined prior to each award. Eligibility shall be 20 21 determined by the department on a competitive basis. The amount 22 awarded to an educational assistant shall be determined by the
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1	department based on need for financial aid and proof of
2	completion of a state-approved certification training program.
3	The maximum amount that an educational assistant may receive
4	under this program shall be an aggregate amount equivalent to
5	tuition payments and costs of textbooks and other instructional
6	materials necessary to complete a state-approved certification
7	training program.
8	(b) There is created in the treasury of the State the
9	educational assistant loan forgiveness program special fund, for
10	the purpose of providing funds pursuant to subsection (a). The
11	following may be deposited into the special fund:
12	appropriations made by the legislature; private contributions;
13	repayment of loans, including interest and payments received on
14	account of principal; moneys received from collection agencies
15	under subsection (g); and moneys from other sources; provided
16	that:
17	(1) Moneys on balance in the special fund at the close of
18	each fiscal year shall remain in that fund and shall
19	not lapse to the credit of the general fund; and
20	(2) An amount from the special fund not exceeding five per
21	cent of the total amount of the special fund may be

1	set by the department to be used for administrative	
2	expenses incurred in administering the special fund.	
3	(c) The department shall adopt rules to implement the	
4	educational assistant loan forgiveness program. The rules shall	<u>11</u>
5	be adopted pursuant to chapter 91, but shall be exempt from the	2
6	public notice and public hearing requirements.	
7	(d) Liability for repayment of a loan shall be canceled	
8	upon the death or permanent total disability of the borrower.	
9	(e) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has	
10	completed a state-approved certification training program and	
11	for each year that the loan recipient teaches in the Hawaii	
12	public school system at a school located in a rural area, loan	
13	forgiveness shall be provided to the recipient as follows:	
14	(1) Ten per cent of the total amount of the loan and	
15	interest shall be waived every year for the first fix	ve
16	years of repayment; and	
17	(2) Twenty-five per cent of the total amount of the loan	
18	and interest shall be waived every year for the sixth	<u>h</u>
19	and seventh years of repayment.	
20	(f) If an educational assistant who is a graduate of a	
21	state-approved certification training program subject to this	
22	section fails to teach in the Hawaii public school system at a	
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- school located in a rural area for a minimum number of years, as 1 determined by the department prior to the award, from the 2 3 recipient's original date of employment with the department, 4 excluding temporary leaves of absence, then the recipient shall 5 repay any remaining loan balance. (g) In accordance with chapter 103D, the department may 6 7 enter into written contracts with collection agencies for the 8 purpose of collecting delinquent loans. All payments collected, 9 exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall revert, and be credited, to the educational assistant loan forgiveness 10 program special fund. A collection agency that enters into a 11 12 written contract with the department for the collection of delinquent loans pursuant to this section may collect a 13 commission from the debtor in accordance with the terms of, and 14 up to the amounts authorized in, the written contract." 15 16 SECTION 3. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new subpart to part II to be appropriately 17 18 designated and to read as follows: Hawaii Educational Assistant Loans 19 20 §304A-A Hawaii educational assistant loans; eligibility; amounts. There is created the Hawaii educational assistant loan 21 program to be administered by the University of Hawaii, to
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22

- 1 provide financial support to students who complete a state-
- 2 approved certification training program, who agree to serve as
- 3 an educational assistant in the Hawaii public school system.
- 4 Eligibility shall be determined by the university on a
- 5 competitive basis. The amount to be loaned to a student shall
- 6 be determined by the board of regents based on need for
- 7 financial aid and proof of acceptance into a state-approved
- 8 certification training program available through the University
- 9 of Hawaii community college system. The maximum amount of loans
- 10 that a student may receive under this program shall be an
- 11 aggregate amount equivalent to tuition payments and costs of
- 12 textbooks and other instructional materials necessary to
- 13 complete a state-approved certification training program.
- 14 §304A-B Repayment of loans; waiver; collection. (a) All
- 15 loans made under this subpart shall bear interest at five per
- 16 cent simple interest. Repayment of principal and interest
- 17 charges shall commence one year after certification or three
- 18 months after a loan recipient ceases to be enrolled in a state-
- 19 approved certification training program and shall be paid in
- 20 periodic installments within a seven-year period. The
- 21 university may charge late fees and all other reasonable costs
- 22 for the collection of delinquent loans.

- 1 (b) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has 2 completed a state-approved certification training program and is employed as a part- or full-time certified educational assistant 3 4 in the Hawaii public school system, one-tenth of the total amount of the loan and interest shall be waived for every year 5 of the first five years, and twenty-five per cent of the total 6 amount of the loan and interest shall be waived every year for 7 8 the sixth and seventh years of repayment that a loan recipient works in a hard-to-fill position as determined by the 9 superintendent of education, including special education, 10 regular education shortage categories, or Title 1 schools, as a 11 12 part- or full-time educational assistant who has met the certification requirements set forth by the department of 13 14 education.
- 15 (c) Liability for repayment of a loan shall be canceled

 16 upon the death or permanent total disability of the loan

 17 recipient.
- (d) If a loan recipient who is a certified educational assistant subject to this section fails to serve in the Hawaii public school system in a hard-to-fill position for a minimum of five consecutive years from the loan recipient's original date of employment with the department of education, excluding

- 1 temporary leaves of absence, then the loan recipient shall repay
- 2 any remaining loan balance at the rate of ten per cent simple
- 3 interest.
- 4 (e) In accordance with chapter 103D, the university may
- 5 enter into written contracts with collection agencies for the
- 6 purpose of collecting delinquent student loans. All payments
- 7 collected, exclusive of a collection agency's commissions, shall
- 8 revert, and be credited, to the Hawaii educational assistant
- 9 loan program special fund established under section 304A-E for
- 10 the Hawaii educational assistant loan program. A collection
- 11 agency that enters into a written contract with the university
- 12 for the collection of delinquent student loans, pursuant to this
- 13 section, may collect a commission from the debtor in accordance
- 14 with the terms of, and up to the amounts authorized in, the
- 15 written contract.
- 16 §304A-C Capacity of minors. Any student otherwise
- 17 qualifying for a loan under this subpart shall not be
- 18 disqualified because the student is under the age of eighteen
- 19 years, and for the purpose of applying for, receiving, and
- 20 repaying the loan, any person shall be deemed to have full legal
- 21 capacity to act and shall have all rights, powers, privileges,
- 22 and obligations of an adult with respect thereto.

1	§304A-D Rules. The university may adopt rules to
2	implement this subpart. The rules shall be adopted pursuant to
3	chapter 91, but shall be exempt from the public notice and
4	public hearing requirements."
5	SECTION 4. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately
7	designated and to read as follows:
8	"§304A-E Hawaii educational assistant loan program special
9	fund. There is established the Hawaii educational assistant
10	loan program special fund, to be administered by the University
11	of Hawaii for the purpose of providing loans pursuant to section
12	304A-A. The following may be deposited into the special fund:
13	appropriations made by the legislature, private contributions,
14	repayment of loans, including interest and payments received on
15	account of principal, and moneys from other sources; provided
16	that:
17	(1) Moneys on balance in the special fund at the close of
18	each fiscal year shall remain in that fund and shall
19	not lapse to the credit of the general fund; and
20	(2) An amount from the special fund not exceeding five per
21	cent of the total amount of outstanding loans may be

1	set by the university to be used for administrative
2	expenses incurred in administering the special fund."
3	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ for
5	fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum for fiscal year 2008-2009
6	for deposit into the educational assistant loan forgiveness
7	program special fund.
8	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the educational
9	assistant loan forgiveness program special fund the sum of
10	\$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
11	year 2007-2008 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for the purposes of the
13	state educational assistant loan forgiveness program.
14	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
15	of education for the purposes of this Act.
16	SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
17	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ for
18	fiscal year 2007-2008 and the same sum for fiscal year 2008-
19	2009, for deposit into the Hawaii educational assistant loan
20	program special fund.
21	SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the educational
22	assistant loan program special fund the sum of \$ or so

- 1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and
- 2 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 3 year 2008-2009 for the purposes of the Hawaii educational
- 4 assistant loan program.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
- 6 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 9. In codifying the new sections added by this
- 8 Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate
- 9 section numbers for the letters used in designating the new
- 10 sections in this Act.
- 11 SECTION 10. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020;
- 13 provided that sections 5, 6, 7, and 8 shall take effect on July
- 14 1, 2020.
