## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 1
- by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 2
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 "§21- Legislative protocol fund; international affairs.
- 5 (a) There is established a legislative protocol fund to be
- 6 administered by the legislature.
- 7 (b) Appropriations made by the legislature shall be
- 8 deposited into the fund.
- 9 (c) The fund shall be used to welcome and extend protocol
- 10 courtesies to visiting international dignitaries and government
- 11 officials."
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 201-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "[{}]§201-17[{}] Office of international affairs;
- established. (a) There is established, within the department 15
- 16 of business, economic development, and tourism, an office of
- international affairs. 17
- 18 The office shall: (b)

6	(3)	Develop and promote international telecommunications

8	(4)	Encourage the development of international sister-city
9		programs, pairing Hawaii cities with cities around the
10		globe for artistic, cultural, economic, educational,
11		and faith-based exchanges;
12	(5)	Develop and promote Hawaii as the economic, trade,
13		commerce, transportation, banking, [and] tourism,
14		regional headquarters, and international conference
15		hub of the [Pacific+] Asia-Pacific region;
16	(6)	Develop an international affairs and peace education
17		curriculum that includes studies of international
18		affairs and peace initiatives and takes a proactive,
19		strategic approach to the development of policies that
20		promote the prevention of national and international

conflict, nonviolent intervention, mediation, peaceful

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1		resolution of conflict, and structured mediation of
2		conflict; [and]
3	(7)	Provide for exchanges of individuals between Hawaii
4		and other nations to develop international and peace-
5		based initiatives[-];
6	<u>(8)</u>	Be the State's central point of contact and
7		accountability in international affairs and serve as
8		the State's advocate for a global orientation;
9	<u>(9)</u>	Inventory existing international programs and develop
10		a web-based information portal to make this
11		information available to the public;
12	(10)	Encourage international conferences to be held in
13		Hawaii;
14	(11)	Encourage the development of international programming
15		and content on local radio shows and a dedicated
16		public access channel for international programs and
17		<u>issues;</u>
18	(12)	Facilitate an international educational links program
19		by increasing collaboration and coordination of
20		international, educational, business, and community
21		organizations and providing funding for activities
22		that shall include but not be limited to:

1		(A)	School excursions from Asia to Hawaii schools,
2			targeting middle and high-school students from
3			Japan, Taiwan, Korea, the Philippines, and China
4			with special focus on Hawaii's sister-states,
5			using the department and its overseas offices to
6			market school excursions to Hawaii and match
7			these overseas school visits with Hawaii schools;
8		(B)	Study abroad programs, targeting middle and high-
9			school students from Hawaii schools focusing on
10			Hawaii's sister-states, and using the department's
11			overseas offices to match Hawaii schools with
12			overseas schools for school-to-school visits and
13			hosting. The office shall fund and encourage
14			funding sources both public and private to help
15			finance the studies abroad; and
16		<u>(C)</u>	Teacher exchange programs through which teachers
17			from Hawaii and abroad exchange their teaching
18			positions for a period of time. The office shall
19			fund and encourage funding sources both public
20			and private to help finance teaching abroad;
21	(13)	<u>Faci</u>	litate an international leaders program by
22			litating the collaboration and coordination of
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1	international, educational, business, and community					
2		organizations and funding activities that shall				
3		include but not be limited to:				
4		(A)	International conferences for high-school			
5			students involving international organizations

7			Asian Affairs Council;

- 1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$60,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary fiscal year
- 5 2008-2009 for the hiring of an executive director and
- 6 administrative assistant for the office of international affairs
- 7 and for operating and program expenses.
- 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 9 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 10 of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
