A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Hawaii is home to two of the world's premier 1 astronomy observatories, Haleakala on Maui and Mauna Kea on 2 Hawaii. Mauna Kea is considered the finest observing site in 3 the world. One of the most critical needs for preserving the 4 value of these sites is to reduce bright sources of light that 5 penetrate the dark night sky. Recent nighttime images from the 6 international space station revealed that some of the brightest 7 sources of light on Maui and Hawaii are the airports and harbors 8 9 on both islands. Astronomers on Mauna Kea are now detecting artificial light sources from urban areas that are diminishing 10 the telescopes' ability to do research. 11

12 The purpose of the Act is to require the department of 13 transportation, to the extent that it is practical, to comply 14 with county ordinances and standards relating to outside 15 lighting for all new installations at airports, harbors, and 16 highways; provided that the compliance with county ordinances 17 and standards do not conflict with any safety regulation or 18 federal law, regulation, or mandate.

2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§262- Outdoor lighting. To the extent that is
5	practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or
6	federal law, regulation, or mandate, if any airport rules or
7	standards relating to outdoor lighting on ramp or apron areas,
8	roadways, and parking lots are in conflict with county
9	ordinances or other rules regarding the same areas, the more
10	stringent requirement or standard shall govern all new
11	installations."
12	SECTION 3. Chapter 264, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately
14	designated and to read as follows:
15	"§264- Highway lighting. To the extent that is
16	practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or
17	federal law, regulation, or mandate, if any highway rules or
18	standards relating to highway lighting are in conflict with any
19	county ordinance or other rules regarding highway lighting, the
20	more stringent requirement or standard shall govern all new
21	installations."

1	SECTION 4. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§266-</u> Outdoor lighting. To the extent that is
5	practical and not in conflict with any safety regulation or
6	federal law, regulation, or mandate, if any harbor rule or
7	standard relating to outdoor lighting at any harbor facility
8	conflicts with any county ordinance or other rule regarding the
9	same areas, the more stringent requirement or standard shall
10	govern all new installations."
11	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
