# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004 (Act 51), 2 as amended by Act 221, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, as amended by Act 22, Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, and as amended by Act 3 4 225, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, required the implementation of 5 a new allocation method, the weighted student formula to distribute funds to schools based upon the characteristics of 6 7 the school's students. Act 51, as amended, also created the 8 committee on weights, whose responsibility is to recommend an allocation formula and various weights of characteristics to the 9 10 board of education. The board of education is required to 11 review the formula annually and recommend changes if necessary. 12 The committee on weights has been in existence for two 13 years. During this time, it has become apparent that schools, 14 principals, and school community councils would benefit from 15 knowing that their funding will be consistent over a two-year 16 period. The legislature finds that this stability in funding 17 would help schools develop and implement academic and financial 18 plans to improve student achievement.

12	student formula pursuant to section 302A-1303.6. The committee		
13	shall:		
14	(1)	Create a list of student characteristics that will be	
15		weighted;	
16	(2)	Create a system of weights based upon the student	
17		characteristics that may be applied to determine the	
18		relative cost of educating any student;	
19	(3)	Determine specific student weights, including their	
20		unit value;	

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1	(4)	Determine which moneys shall be included in the amount	
2		of funds to be allocated through the weighted student	
3		formula;	
4	(5)	Recommend a weighted student formula to the board [ $\overline{of}$	
5		education];	
6	(6)	Perform any other function that may facilitate the	
7		implementation of the weighted student formula; and	
8	(7)	Meet not less than annually to review the weighted	
9		student formula and, if the committee deems it	
10		necessary, recommend a new weighted student formula	
11		for adoption by the board [ <del>of education.</del> ] <u>;</u>	
12	provided that the committee on weights shall provide the board		
13	and the legislature with rationale for any findings and		
14	recommendations made, including changes to the weighted student		
15	formula and weighted student formula characteristics or weights		
16	for those characteristics, and the effects and costs associated		
17	with any recommended changes."		
18	SECTION 3. Section 302A-1303.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes,		
19	is amended to read as follows:		
20	"§302A-1303.6 Weighted student formula. Based upon		
21	recommendations from the committee on weights, the board [ $ heta f$		
22	education	], not less than [ <del>annually,</del> ] <u>biennially</u> , shall adopt a	
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weighted student formula for the allocation of moneys to public 1 schools that takes into account the educational needs of each 2 3 student. The department, upon the receipt of appropriated moneys, shall use the weighted student formula to allocate funds 4 5 to public schools. Principals shall expend moneys provided to the principals' schools. This section shall only apply to 6 7 charter schools for fiscal years in which the charter schools 8 elect pursuant to section 302B-13 to receive allocations 9 according to the weighted student formula." 10 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
