- 3 The game mammal management and control plans for each
- 4 island shall be periodically updated to account for any changes
- 5 relating to the management, implementation, and enforcement of
- 6 rules, or activities of the game mammal management areas. In
- 7 updating the game mammal management and control plans for each
- 8 island, the department of land and natural resources, division
- 9 of forestry and wildlife, shall provide opportunities for
- 10 hunters who use the game mammal management areas to contribute
- 11 input and any concerns with respect to the game mammal
- 12 management areas.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$180,000 or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and the
- 16 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 17 2008-2009 to the department of land and natural resources,
- 18 division of forestry and wildlife, for the support and
- 19 implementation of research and planning for game mammal
- 20 management and control and to produce game mammal management and
- 21 control plans.

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 2 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. The department of land and natural resources,
- 4 division of forestry and wildlife, shall submit to the
- 5 legislature a report on its activities under this Act no later
- 6 than twenty days before the convening of the 2008 regular
- 7 session and every year thereafter. The department shall submit
- 8 to the legislature game mammal management and control plans for
- 9 Oahu and for as many other islands as it may have developed such
- 10 plans no later than twenty days before the convening of the 2009
- 11 regular session.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
