A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHER LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's public schools would be well served if there were an abundance of 2 highly qualified teachers from which public school principals 3 could select. 4 SECTION 2. Section 302A-802, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 6 7 "(C) The board shall adopt policies, exempt from chapters 91 and 92, to initiate the following: 8 Develop criteria allowing more individuals with trade 9 (1)or industry experience to teach in vocational, 10 11 technical, and career pathway programs, and criteria 12 for the issuance of permits allowing qualified individuals to teach when recommended by the 13 superintendent. Requires the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board to pursue full teacher license reciprocity with all other states; authorizes the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board to issue licenses to out-ofstate teacher licensure, based on certain criteria; provided that upon the adoption of administrative rules to accomplish that purpose the rules shall supersede the statutory requirement.
