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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The purpose of this part is to promote fiscal
3	accountability with regard to agricultural land lease agreements
4	between the State and lessees by allowing the agribusiness
5	development corporation to contract with financial institutions
6	to provide lease management services.
7	SECTION 2. Section 163D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	<pre>"[+] §163D-7 [+] Agricultural projects; agricultural</pre>
10	development plans. (a) The corporation may develop and
11	implement agricultural projects where large tracts of
12	agricultural land have been or will be taken out of productive
13	agriculture or where, through detailed analysis, opportunities
14	exist to exploit potential local, national, and international
15	markets.

16 (b) The corporation may initiate and coordinate the17 preparation of business and agricultural development plans for

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its projects. The plans shall include a proposal for the 1 organization of the enterprise, a marketing information and 2 strategy, the impact on existing agricultural operations 3 throughout the State, and a recommendation for the construction, 4 reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, alteration, or 5 6 repair of any infrastructure or accessory facilities in 7 connection with any project. The corporation may enter into cooperative agreements 8 (c) with coordinating entrepreneurs or public agencies when the 9 10 powers, services, and capabilities of the persons or agencies are deemed necessary and appropriate for the development and 11 implementation of the business and agricultural development 12 13 plans. The corporation may purchase, accept, and maintain 14 (d) permanent conservation easements, or transfer them to a 15 qualified land trust, in accordance with the federal Natural 16 Resources Conservation Service Farm and Ranch Lands Protection 17 18 program. 19 Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the (e) contrary, when leasing agricultural land under the corporation's 20

21 control, the corporation may contract with a financial

22 institution chartered under chapter 412 or a federal financial

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1	institution, as defined under section 412:1-109, which is
2	transacting business in this State to provide lease management
3	services. For the purposes of this subsection, "lease
4	management services" includes the collection of lease rent and
5	any other moneys owed to the corporation related to the lease of
6	agricultural land under the corporation's control.
7	$\left[\frac{d}{d}\right]$ (f) The agricultural planning activities of the
8	corporation shall be coordinated with the county planning
9	departments and the county land use plans, policies, and
10	ordinances.
11	$\left[\frac{(e)}{(e)}\right]$ (g) The corporation may amend the business and
12	agricultural development plans as may be necessary.
13	$\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$ (h) Any undertaking by the corporation pursuant to
14	this chapter shall be with the express written consent of the
15	landowner or landowners directly affected."
16	PART II
17	SECTION 3. The purpose of this part is to ensure the long-
18	term availability of lands suitable for agricultural activities
19	by authorizing the agribusiness development corporation to lease
20	lands acquired under this Act for up to fifty-five years.
21	SECTION 4. Section 163D-15.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22	amended to read as follows:

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1	"[+]§163D-15.6 Commitment and preservation of agricultural
2	leases.[]] (a) The agribusiness development corporation shall
3	work toward obtaining commitments from landowners in the leeward
4	and central districts of Oahu that their agricultural leases
5	shall be for a duration of twenty or more years[$_{ au}$] and shall not
6	be amended or revoked [in order] to allow for a nonagricultural
7	use of [such] the land[+]; provided that for lands in Kunia,
8	Ewa, or north of Wahiawa and Schofield on the island of Oahu
9	acquired under Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, the
10	agricultural leases shall be for no more than fifty-five years.
11	(b) To further ensure the preservation of agriculture in
12	the leeward and central districts of Oahu, the agribusiness
13	development corporation shall monitor the agricultural leases of
14	lands [utilizing] using the water from the Waiahole water
15	system. In the event of any proposed amendment or revocation of
16	any such lease, the corporation shall do all things within its
17	powers under [-{]this chapter[-] to protect and defend the
18	interests of the agricultural leaseholders to ensure the
19	continuation of agricultural use for those lands."
20	PART III
21	SECTION 5. The purpose of this part is to comply with
22	article XI, sections 3 and 10 of the state constitution,
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relating to the protection of agricultural lands and the
 promotion of farm ownership and diversified agriculture, by
 establishing a process to ensure that certain lands in the
 Kunia, Ewa, or north of Wahiawa and Schofield areas, or all on
 the island of Oahu:

6 (1) Remain available for agricultural use;

7 (2) Are properly managed to ensure continued economic
8 viability while being used for agriculture; and
9 (3) Are managed in a manner that is sensitive to and
10 consistent with the needs of farmers in the Kunia or
11 Ewa areas, or both.

12 The legislature finds that this part is in accordance with 13 article XI, sections 3 and 10 of the state constitution, is in 14 the public interest, and will preserve agricultural activities 15 in the area and a lifestyle that benefits the Kunia, Ewa, and 16 Wahiawa communities and the communities at large.

SECTION 6. (a) The agribusiness development corporation
is authorized to purchase agricultural lands located in the
Kunia, Ewa, and north of Wahiawa and Schofield on the island of
Oahu.

(b) The agribusiness development corporation may purchasethe lands with a combination of revenues derived through the



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issuance of revenue bonds pursuant to section 163D-9, Hawaii
 Revised Statutes, and moneys appropriated under section 8 of
 this Act.

4 (c) The agribusiness development corporation shall submit
5 to the legislature a progress report on its actions to obtain
6 Kunia, Ewa, and agricultural lands north of Wahiawa and
7 Schofield on the island of Oahu no later than twenty days prior
8 to the convening of the regular session of 2008.

9 SECTION 7. Section 163D-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

11 The corporation, with the approval of the governor, "(a) 12 may issue, from time to time, revenue bonds in amounts not 13 exceeding the total amount of bonds authorized to be issued by 14 the legislature for the purpose of constructing, acquiring, remodeling, furnishing, and equipping any project facility, 15 including the acquisition of the site thereof [-], or for 16 17 acquiring agricultural lands through purchase to sustain and preserve viable agricultural enterprises within a contiguous 18 19 geographic area."

20 SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 22 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for 2007-2333 HB337 SD1 SMA.doc



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1	purchasing agricultural lands in Kunia, Ewa, and north of
2	Wahiawa and Schofield on the island of Oahu.
3	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the agribusiness
4	development corporation for the purposes of this part.

7	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
8	SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.

Report Title:

Agricultural Lands; Agribusiness; Kunia, Ewa, and North of Wahiawa and Schofield

Description:

Authorizes the agribusiness development corporation to use revenue bonds to purchase agricultural land, including in Kunia, Ewa, or north of Wahiawa and Schofield on Oahu. Appropriates funds to purchase these lands. Enables the agribusiness development corporation to contract with banks to provide lease management services. Allows the agribusiness development corporation to lease agricultural lands in these areas for up to 55 years. (SD1)
