# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Today's students are living in an increasingly 2 technology-driven world. Statistics indicate that ninety per 3 cent of children and adolescents from ages five to seventeen use computers. About fifty-nine per cent of them use the Internet. 4 To continue captivating the minds of our youth, public 5 education must adapt and function within the context of their 6 changing world by applying technology. 7 Access to knowledge and information has expanded 8 9 exponentially due to the Internet. Such powerful technology should be taken advantage of to enhance the learning experiences 10 11 of students. 12 Online learning opens up many opportunities for students,

13 and more and more educators and policymakers across the nation 14 are recognizing the benefits of education unconstrained by time 15 and place. As of September 2006, thirty-eight states either had 16 policies in place for online education, offered a state-led 17 online learning program, or both.
