A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EDUCATOR LOAN PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In 2001, the Hawaii educator loan program and 2 special fund were established to recruit college students to 3 become educators and to ensure that these graduates teach in our public schools. The legislature finds that although the program 4 has proven to be successful, the State is still experiencing a 5 6 teacher shortage. In particular, hard-to-fill positions, 7 including special education, regular education shortage 8 categories, and teacher positions in rural areas have posed a 9 significant teacher recruitment and retention challenge for our 10 public schools.

11 The purpose of this Act is to establish an educator loan 12 forgiveness programs to recruit and retain qualified teachers to 13 teach in public schools located in rural areas throughout the 14 State, to amend the loan forgiveness schedule for the Hawaii 15 educator loan program, and to appropriate funds for these 16 programs.

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1	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§302A- Educator loan forgiveness program; special fund.
5	(a) There is created the educator loan forgiveness program to
6	be administered by the department in partnership with a
7	financial institution whose operations are principally conducted
8	in Hawaii, for the purpose of providing financial support to
9	teachers who complete a state-approved teacher education program
10	and agree to teach in the Hawaii public school system at a
11	school located in a rural area, as determined by the department
12	and for a period of time to be determined prior to each award.
13	Eligibility shall be determined by the department on a
14	competitive basis. The amount awarded to a teacher shall be
15	determined by the department based on need for financial aid and
16	proof of a state-approved teacher education degree. The maximum
17	amount that a teacher may receive under this program shall be an
18	aggregate amount equivalent to tuition payments and costs of
19	textbooks and other instructional materials necessary to
20	complete a state-approved certification training program.
21	(b) There is created in the treasury of the State the
22	educator loan forgiveness program special fund, for the purpose
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1	of providing funds pursuant to subsection (a). The following
2	may be deposited into the special fund: appropriations made by
3	the legislature; private contributions; repayment of loans,
4	including interest and payments received on account of
5	principal; moneys received from collection agencies under
6	subsection (g); and moneys from other sources; provided that:
7	(1) Moneys on balance in the special fund at the close of
8	each fiscal year shall remain in that fund and shall
9	not lapse to the credit of the general fund; and
10	(2) An amount from the special fund not exceeding five per
11	cent of the total amount of the special fund may be
12	set by the department to be used for administrative
13	expenses incurred in administering the special fund.
14	(c) The department shall adopt rules to implement the
15	educator loan forgiveness program. The rules shall be adopted
16	pursuant to chapter 91, but shall be exempt from the public
17	notice and public hearing requirements.
18	(d) Liability for repayment of a loan shall be canceled
19	upon the death or permanent total disability of the borrower.
20	(e) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has
21	completed a state-approved teacher education program and for
22	each year that the loan recipient teaches in the Hawaii public
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1	school sy	stem at a school located in a rural area, loan
2	forgivene	ss shall be provided to the recipient as follows:
3	(1)	Ten per cent of the total amount of the loan and
4		interest shall be waived every year for the first five
5		years of repayment; and
6	(2)	Twenty-five per cent of the total amount of the loan
7		and interest shall be waived every year for the sixth
8		and seventh years of repayment.
9	<u>(f)</u>	If a loan recipient who is a graduate of a state-
10	approved	teacher education program subject to this section fails
11	to teach	in the Hawaii public school system at a school located
12	<u>in a rura</u>	l area for a minimum number of years, as determined by
13	the depar	tment prior to the award, from the recipient's original
14	<u>date of e</u>	mployment with the department, excluding temporary
15	<u>leaves of</u>	absence, then the recipient shall repay any remaining
16	loan bala	nce.
17	(g)	In accordance with chapter 103D, the department may
18	enter int	o written contracts with collection agencies for the
19	purpose o	f collecting delinquent loans. All payments collected,
20	exclusive	of a collection agency's commissions, shall revert,
21	and be cr	edited, to the educator loan forgiveness program
22	special f	und. A collection agency that enters into a written

1 contract with the department for the collection of delinquent 2 loans pursuant to this section may collect a commission from the debtor in accordance with the terms of, and up to the amounts 3 4 authorized in, the written contract." 5 SECTION 3. Section 304A-702, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 6 7 "(a) All loans made under this subpart shall bear interest 8 at five per cent simple interest. Repayment of principal and 9 interest charges shall commence one year after graduation or 10 three months after a loan recipient ceases to be enrolled in a 11 state-approved teacher education program and shall be paid in 12 periodic installments within a [six-year] seven-year period.

13 The university may charge late fees and all other reasonable14 costs for the collection of delinquent loans.

(b) Upon a showing of proof that the loan recipient has
completed a state-approved teacher education program and is
employed as a full-time teacher in the Hawaii public school
system, one-tenth of the total amount of the loan and interest
shall be waived for every year of the first five years, and [the
remaining balance shall be waived after the sixth year] twentyfive per cent of the total amount of the loan and interest shall

22 be waived every year for the sixth and seventh years of

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1 repayment that a loan recipient teaches in a Hawaii public 2 school in a hard-to-fill position as determined by the 3 superintendent of education, including special education, 4 regular education shortage categories, or Title 1 schools, and 5 in one of the following capacities: (1) As an elementary school teacher teaching in the field 6 7 of elementary education who has met standards as set forth by the Hawaii teacher standards board; or 8 (2) As a secondary school teacher teaching in the subject 9 area that is relevant to the loan recipient's academic 10 11 major as certified by the department of education who has met standards as set forth by the Hawaii teacher 12 standards board." 13 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 14 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for 16 deposit into the educator loan forgiveness program special fund. 17 18 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the educational assistant loan forgiveness program special fund the sum of 19 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 20 Ś 21 year 2007-2008 for the purposes of the state educator loan 22 forgiveness program.

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1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2	of education for the purposes of this Act.
3	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1 or so much thereof
5	as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to be deposited
6	into the Hawaii educator loan program special fund to be used
7	for student loans.
8	SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii
9	educator loan program special fund the sum of \$1 or so much
10	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 to be used
11	for student loans.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
13	Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
14	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
