A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EARLY EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that pursuant to Act 219, 2 Session Laws of Hawaii, a two-tier junior kindergarten and 3 kindergarten program was established with the requirement that developmentally appropriate curriculum be implemented for each 4 5 tier. The program to be established was intended to be flexible 6 enough to allow junior kindergarten students who are ready to participate in kindergarten to do so and to allow students who 7 8 require additional support to move from kindergarten to junior 9 kindergarten. The department of education was tasked with 10 assisting the schools in the development of the two-tier program 11 with pilot strategies being encouraged during the 2005-2006 12 school year and full implementation being required beginning 13 with the 2006-2007 school year.

14 The legislature further finds that, since the law's 15 enactment, curriculum for the two-tier program has not been 16 clearly established for junior kindergarteners. Instead, junior 17 kindergarteners are being taught the kindergarten curriculum, no



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1	criteria	was established for passing junior kindergartners to	
2	first grade, and junior kindergarteners are being permitted to		
3	go straight to first grade, despite the fact that they may be		
4	ill-prepared or need further support or assistance before		
5	transitioning. It was the legislature's intent to provide for a		
6	curriculum that specifically addressed the needs of junior		
7	kindergarteners, as children of ages four and five possess		
8	differing	skill sets and social and emotional maturity levels.	
9	The purpose of this Act is to:		
10	(1)	Prohibit the moving of junior kindergarten and	
11		kindergarten students between tiers;	
12	(2)	Prohibit a junior kindergartener from directly	
13		graduating to first grade;	
14	(3)	Ensure that a separate curriculum is established for	
15		the junior kindergarten program;	
16	(4)	Require the department of education to staff junior	
17		kindergartens with qualified preschool teachers and	
18		preschool teacher aides;	
19	(5)	Require the Hawaii teacher standards board to develop	
20		standards for teachers and teacher aides assigned to	
21		junior kindergarten classrooms; and

1	(6) Appropriate funds for the implementation of a junior
2	kindergarten program that achieves a ten to one
3	student ratio.
4	SECTION 2. Section 302A-411, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	"§302A-411 Junior kindergarten and kindergarten program;
7	establishment; attendance. (a) The department shall establish
8	and maintain junior kindergartens and kindergartens with a
9	program of instruction as a part of the public school system;
10	provided that:
11	(1) Attendance shall not be mandatory; and
12	(2) Charter schools shall be excluded from mandatory
13	participation in the program.
14	(b) The department shall establish a two-tier junior
15	kindergarten and kindergarten program to support the range of
16	developmental abilities of children in junior kindergarten and
17	kindergarten. [Any school may move students between junior
18	kindergarten and kindergarten as the school deems appropriate.
19	Junior kindergarten students may graduate directly to grade
20	one.] The program shall include separate curricula for junior
21	kindergarten and kindergarten students that is narrowly tailored
22	to the specific needs and abilities of students in each tier.
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1	In develo	ping the curriculum for each tier, the department may	
2	review and consider the use of existing preschool curriculum.		
3	The progr	am shall include any or all of the following models:	
4	(1)	Classrooms composed exclusively of either junior	
5		kindergarten or kindergarten students; and	
6	(2)	Coordination with public, private, or public-private	
7		entities to address the needs of junior kindergarten-	
8		eligible students within the school's community[; and	
9	(3)	The blending of junior kindergarten and kindergarten	
10		students in a single classroom].	
11	(c)	Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, a child who	
12	will be a	t least five years of age on or before December 31 of	

14 Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, a child who will be at 15 least five years of age on or before August 1 of the school year 16 may attend a public school kindergarten. Beginning with the 17 2006-2007 school year, a child who will be at least five years 18 of age after August 1 and before January 1 of the school year 19 may attend a public school junior kindergarten.

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1	hired for junior kindergartens beginning with the 2008-2009
2	school year. The qualifications of preschool teachers and
3	preschool teacher aides to be hired shall be as follows:
4	(1) Preschool teachers who are hired for junior
5	kindergarten shall have, at a minimum, a bachelor's
6	degree from an accredited teacher preparation program;
7	and
8	(2) Preschool teacher aides who are hired for junior
9	kindergarten shall have, at a minimum, an associate's
10	degree in early childhood education from an accredited
11	program.
12	[(d)] <u>(e)</u> The department may accept gifts to establish and
13	maintain junior kindergartens and kindergartens."
14	SECTION 3. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§302A-803 Powers and duties of the board. In addition to
17	establishing standards for the issuance and renewal of licenses
18	and any other powers and duties authorized by law, the board's
19	powers shall also include:
20	(1) Setting and administering its own budget;

1	(2)	Adopting, amending, repealing, or suspending the	
2		policies, standards, or rules of the board in	
3		accordance with chapter 91;	
4	(3)	Receiving grants or donations from private	
5		foundations, and state and federal funds;	
6	(4)	Submitting an annual report to the governor and the	
7		legislature on the board's operations and from the	
8		2007-2008 school year, submitting a summary report	
9		every five years of the board's accomplishment of	
10		objectives, efforts to improve or maintain teacher	
11		quality, and efforts to keep its operations responsive

Junior Kindergarten; Curriculum; Teachers and Teachers Aides; Appropriation

Description:

Prohibits the moving of junior kindergarten and kindergarten students between tiers; prohibits a junior kindergartener from directly graduating to first grade; ensures that separate curriculum is established for the junior kindergarten program; requires the department of education to staff junior kindergartens with qualified preschool teachers and preschool teacher aides; requires the Hawaii teacher standards board to develop standards for teachers and teacher aides assigned to junior kindergarten classrooms; and appropriates funds for the implementation of a junior kindergarten program that achieves a ten to one student ratio.
