A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROPERTY DAMAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. There is established in the city and county of
- 2 Honolulu a two year pilot project to develop and evaluate a
- 3 program for the acquisition, placement, operation, and
- 4 maintenance of video surveillance cameras for the purpose of
- 5 deterring property damage offenses, especially graffiti, and
- prosecuting offenders. 6
- The project shall evaluate and acquire video 7
- 8 surveillance systems using criteria including, but not limited
- 9 to, the following:
- 10 Quality of the image captured, including digital or
- 11 analog technology, lines of resolution, color or black
- 12 and white, night vision capability, and video or still
- photography; 13
- (2) Camera controls, including tilt, pan, and zoom 14
- 15 capacity, remote operation by wireless, computer, or
- 16 internet based system, and associated software, and

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1		automatic operation by motion, sound, or light
2		detection;
3	(3)	On site audible or flashing light alarm systems
4		triggered by offender activity and remote notification
5		to police that activity has been captured by page,
6		electronic mail, or telephone;
7	(4)	Media on which images shall be recorded and stored,
8		whether at the surveillance site or other, remote
9		location;
10	(5)	Portability or ability to relocate the system to
11		target high offense activity areas, including self-
12		contained power and wireless data transfer;
13	(6)	Availability of manufacturer or vendor support,
14		including warranties;
15	(7)	Previous use for evidence gathering purposes; and
16	(8)	Cost of acquisition.
17	(b)	The project shall place the systems acquired in
18	locations	known or likely to be the target of property damage
19	offenders,	especially those who "tag" property with graffiti, as
20	defined by	section 46-1.5(24)(C).

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1	(c)	The project shall establish and evaluate procedures	
2	for opera	tion of the systems including, but not limited to the	
3	following:		
4	(1)	Whether the system will be operated by police or	
5		civilian personnel; and	
6	(2)	How images will be retrieved and preserved in order to	
7		fulfill any chain of custody requirements for	
8		admission as evidence in court proceedings.	
9	(d)	The project shall establish and evaluate procedures	
10	for maint	enance of the systems including, but not limited to the	
11	following	:	
12	(1)	Whether maintenance will be performed by the police,	
13		the vendor, or other third party;	
14	(2)	Whether systems will be removed for evaluation and	
15		preventive maintenance or replaced only upon	
16		malfunction; and	
17	(3)	Whether additional, stand-by equipment will be used to	
18		replace systems undergoing maintenance in order to	
19		preserve surveillance capacity at the chosen location.	
20	(0)	Whore sufficient evidence is obtained by use of the	

surveillance system to establish the commission of an offense

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- and the identity of the offender, the project shall recommend 1
- 2 prosecution of the offender.
- SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 3
- revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much 4
- thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the 5
- 6 same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 2008-2009, for purposes of the pilot project to deter property 7
- damage offenses, especially graffiti, and prosecute offenders. 8
- 9 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the city and
- county of Honolulu for the purposes of this Act. 10
- SECTION 4. The city and county of Honolulu shall report to 11
- 12 the legislature not later than twenty days prior to the
- convening of the regular sessions of 2008 and 2009 on the 13
- progress of the project, including any recommendations regarding 14
- 15 legislation and amounts and means of funding.
- SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007, and 16
- 17 shall be repealed on June 30, 2009.

Description:
