A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 302A-1124, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:

3 "(e) Unless otherwise specified, each school community
4 council shall establish policies governing the council's
5 composition, election, staggered terms of office for members,
6 operation, and vacancies; provided that:

7 (1) The number of school personnel [+]on[+] any school
8 community council shall be equal to the number of
9 primary stakeholders on the school community council;
10 (2) At the elementary and middle school levels, each
11 school community council shall be composed of the

12 principal and at least one member representing each of 13 the following groups:

14 (A) Parents elected by ballots distributed among and 15 collected from the parents of the school's 16 students;

17 (B) Teachers elected by ballots [distributed among 18 and collected from teachers of the school;]

1 The legislature finds that much of an individual's 2 cognitive, emotional, and social development takes place in 3 their earliest years of life. To a significant extent, 4 opportunities during this age set the parameters for an 5 individual's development throughout the rest of the individual's 6 life. The legislature further finds that grade three is a 7 pivotal year in preparation for the No Child Left Behind Act's 8 assessment plans. For this reason, children in the preceding 9 grades should be provided with the instructional support needed 10 to ensure superior performance in assessment instruments 11 mandated by the No Child Left Behind Act.

12 For these reasons, the Legislature finds that a class size 13 of not more than twenty-five students per teacher [to be 14 advisable] is necessary in kindergarten, grade one, and grade 15 two classrooms.

16 The purpose of this part is to appropriate funding to:17 (1) Provide mathematics textbooks and other mathematics

- 18 learning materials;
- 19 (2) Reduce class size in kindergarten, grade one, and20 grade two;
- 21 (3) Provide for full-time, year-round, high school student
 22 activity coordinators; and

1 (4) Programs that support parents in working with students 2 who need additional help to succeed in school provided 3 the programs have measurable outcomes." 4 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so 6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 7 8 year 2008-2009, to reduce kindergarten class size to establish 9 an eighteen-to-one student to teacher ratio and to reduce junior 10 kindergarten class size to establish a ten-to-one student to 11 teacher ratio. 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 13 of education for the purposes of this Act. 14 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and 17 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 18 year 2008-2009, for establishing new teacher advisors/peer 19 assistance mentors with the target of achieving a ratio of fifteen new teachers to one new teacher advisor/peer assistance 20 21 mentor within each school complex area.
