A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that national and Hawaii
- 2 analyses indicate that low-income students, even the highest
- 3 academic achieving ones, are significantly less likely to
- 4 participate in post secondary education compared with their more
- 5 affluent peers. A major obstacle to their enrollment in post
- 6 secondary education is a lack of academic preparation that is
- 7 motivated, in part, by the misperception that college tuition is
- 8 exorbitant and that the cost must be paid out-of-pocket.
- 9 The GEAR UP scholars program in Hawaii and other similar
- 10 programs demonstrate the success of programs that provide
- 11 college scholarships as an incentive for students to pledge to
- 12 prepare themselves early for college.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to further encourage Hawaii
- 14 residents to pursue post secondary education by appropriating
- 15 funds for the B Plus scholarship program and changing the
- 16 program's eligibility criteria.

3	amended by amending section 57 to read as follows:	
4	"SECTION 57. Provided that of the general fund	
5	appropriation for the University of Hawaii systemwide (UOH 900)	
6	the sum of $[\$500,000]$ $\$1,500,000$, or so much thereof as may be	
7	necessary for fiscal year [$\frac{2005-2006}{2007-2008}$] and the sum of	
8	[\$1,000,000] \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary	
9	for fiscal year $[\frac{2006-2007}{7}]$ $2008-2009$; provided further that	
10	the amounts shall be used to fund the B Plus scholarship	
11	program; provided further that the university shall offer	
12	scholarships to any Hawaii resident who:	
13	(1) Enro	lls in any campus within the university system;
14	(2) Has (graduated from a Hawaii public high school with a
15	cumu	lative grade point average of 3.0 or better $[au]$ and
16	has o	completed a rigorous high school curriculum;
17	(3) Is e	ligible for need-based financial aid based on
18	fede	ral financial aid guidelines; and
19	<u>(4)</u> Has]	pledged, via an early intervention program, to
20	meet	the requirements for the B Plus scholarship;

- 1 and provided further that the scholarship may be renewed
- 2 annually if the student maintains satisfactory academic progress
- 3 and continues to meet financial aid guidelines."
- 4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
