SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF INTEGRATING PEACE EDUCATION INTO THE SCHOOL CURRICULUM.

WHEREAS, our country is currently involved in a war in Iraq 1 that has killed thousands of American and Iraqi peoples, has 2 3 cost the United States over 365 billion dollars, and to which there seems to be no end in sight; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the violence that exists within our country is 6 reflected in the behavior of our youth, as demonstrated by the 7 increase in bullying in schools and situations like the 8 Columbine High School massacre; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Hawaii is very culturally, ethnically, and 11 religiously diverse, making our state unique and beautiful, but 12 such a mixture can also lead to misunderstandings that can 13 sometimes escalate into violence; and 14 15 WHEREAS, some of the aggression that has afflicted mainland 16 schools has also afflicted Hawaii's classrooms, with incidents 17 of guns in schools, and severe beatings and psychological abuse 18 among peers; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the level of violence within our country and 21 consequently, in our schools, is growing at an alarming rate, 22 23 and it is becoming increasingly necessary to find other ways of resolving conflict besides fighting; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, there are models of experiential learning that 27 stimulate critical thinking and teach students to work together to solve some of Hawaii's complex social issues, thereby 28 fostering a life of compassion and an understanding of inter-29 dependence between peers; and 30 31 32 WHEREAS, students would benefit greatly from interdependent activities that would help them gain knowledge of and 33 SCR HMS 2007-2912

5 6	HURDENS the Department of Education (DOE) has already	
0 7	WHEREAS, the Department of Education (DOE) has already included character education in its standards of learning;	
8	according to its "living aloha through civil education" website,	
0 9	all schools will implement a comprehensive approach to character

21		character as well as being responsive to teachable

31	would work together with and significantly enhance character

38	peace education into the school curriculum, that would integrate lessons from other institutions such as the Pacific Buddhist

40 41	of which are dedicated to decreasing violence and establishing

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that DOE is requested to submit a 1 2 report to the Legislature, no later than twenty days prior to convening of the regular session of 2008, on the progress of its 3 4 study, including: 5 (1)The ideas that have resulted from its discussions; and 6 7 8 (2) Any projected costs related to integrating peace education into the school curriculum: 9 10 and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 13 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 14 Board of Education and Superintendent of Education. 15 16 17 18
