SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO STUDY OTHER STATES' ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES AND COMPARE THEM TO HAWAII'S ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES.

WHEREAS, the United States Senate Special Committee on 1 Aging has estimated that up to five million adults each year are 2 3 victims of neglect, exploitation, or other abuse; and 4 5 WHEREAS, other studies indicate that up to six per cent of 6 the national population of older adults has experienced some 7 type of abuse, neglect, or exploitation; and 8 WHEREAS, there is no national, uniform reporting system to 9 10 document the numbers of older Americans who experience abuse, so the number of these individuals can only be estimated; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, adult protective services are mandated for adult victims of abuse in each of the fifty states and the District of 14 Columbia: and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, the eligible recipients of these services vary by jurisdiction; and 18 19 WHEREAS, in most states, services are provided to any 20 vulnerable adult, while in other states the services are 21 provided only to individuals age sixty years and older or to 22 younger individuals with disabilities; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, results of a recent Elder Abuse Incidence Study shed light on a significant problem of elder abuse and neglect 26 27 among elders living in their own homes and who have gone largely 28 unidentified and unnoticed; and 29 WHEREAS, the study noted that only one in five new 30 31 incidents of abuse, neglect, or self-neglect are reported to 32 adult protective services agencies; and



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1 2 WHEREAS, here in Hawaii, adult protective services provides crisis intervention, investigation, and emergency services to 3 dependent adults who are reported to be abused, neglected, or 4 5 financially exploited by others or seriously endangered due to self-neglect; and 6 7 WHEREAS, there are just over eighty-four thousand elders 8 9 that are seventy-five years or older in Hawaii; and 10 WHEREAS, national estimates of the frequency of abuse 11 towards this population range from five to ten per cent, which 12 13 suggests that there may be four thousand or more cases of abuse in Hawaii each year; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, however, the Department of Human Services indicates that in 2006, it investigated five hundred fourteen 17 cases, which suggests a large gap between those receiving 18 services and those possibly experiencing abuse; and 19 20 WHEREAS, there has been a great deal of discussion 21 regarding whether the Department of Human Services is serving 22 23 those who are most in need of adult protective services; and 24 WHEREAS, there has also been concern regarding whether any 25 26 changes to the current Adult Protective Services Law would result in an increased case load and consequential strain on 27 28 case workers; now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the 31 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislative 32 Reference Bureau is requested to study other states' adult 33 protective services and compare them to Hawaii's adult 34 protective services; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in completing the study, the Legislative Reference Bureau should: 38 39 40 Examine the other states' adult protective services (1)41 laws and their implementation in the respective 42 states; 43



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- Obtain information regarding the total number of cases (2)1 reported to the adult protective services of each 2 state and the ratio of cases per capita for each 3 4 state: 5 Discuss the typical case load for case workers in each (3) 6 state; and 7 8 (4)Discuss the consequences of any expansion of services 9 or changes to adult protective services laws in the 10 various states, including whether the total number of 11 cases increased or decreased and the resulting case 12 load for case workers; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 15 Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings to the 16 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 17 the 2008 Regular Session; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 20 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the 21 Legislative Reference Bureau. 22 23 24 25
