SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

	REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO
	ESTABLISH UNIFORM RULES AND PERMITTING PROCEDURES FOR
	PUBLIC BEACH WEDDINGS.
1	WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to some of the world's most
2	spectacular beaches; and
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4	WHEREAS, these beautiful and serene beaches are becoming
5	popular locations for wedding ceremonies for residents of Hawaii
6	and tourists from all over the world; and
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8	WHEREAS, Hawaii has a proud history of ensuring public
9	access for all to its beaches and shorelines; and
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11	WHEREAS, recently, couples planning beach weddings in
12	Hawaii have been receiving inconsistent information on
13	permitting procedures and requirements, often being told that
14	permits are not required; and
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16	WHEREAS, on several occasions, beach wedding ceremonies
17	have been interrupted by enforcement officials from different
18	divisions of the Department of Land and Natural Resources in an
19	effort to enforce inconsistent permitting procedures; and
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21	WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources has
22	acknowledged that uniform rules need to be adopted to address
23	these inconsistencies; and
24 25	WHEREAS, chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides the
25 26	Department of Land and Natural Resources with jurisdiction over
20 27	public lands, which includes state-controlled beaches and small
27 28	boat harbors; and
20 29	boat harborb, and
29 30	WHEREAS, the State's primary role in the shoreline area is
31	to preserve and protect coastal resources and support public
32	access along and below the shoreline; and
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1 WHEREAS, generally, the counties have the primary authority 2 and duty to develop and maintain public access to and along the 3 shorelines; and 4 5 WHEREAS, two divisions within the State's Department of 6 Land and Natural Resources, the Conservation and Resource 7 Enforcement Division and the Division of Boating and Ocean 8 Recreation, seem to have conflicting rules regarding permit 9 10 requirements for beach weddings; and 11 WHEREAS, the Conservation and Resource Enforcement 12 13 Division, with full police powers, enforces all state laws and rules involving state lands, state parks, historic sites, forest 14 reserves, aquatic life and wildlife areas, coastal zones, 15 conservation districts, state shores, as well as county 16 ordinances involving county parks; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the 20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land 21 and Natural Resources is requested to establish uniform rules 22 and permitting procedures for weddings on state-controlled 23 24 beaches and to ensure consistent intra-agency enforcement of the rules; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 27 Natural Resources is requested to cooperate with the counties in 28 establishing appropriate rules and permits for beach weddings; 29 and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested adopt rules and permitting 33 procedures that allow for the issuance of annual and daily beach 34 wedding permits, where appropriate; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested to require a beach wedding permit 38 when twenty-five or more chairs are to be set-up on the beach 39 and unattended for thirty minutes or more; and 40 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources submit a report on the actions taken pursuant 43

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1 to this measure to the Legislature no later than twenty days 2 prior to the convening of the 2008 Regular Session; and 3

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 6 Department of Land and Natural Resources, the Administrator of 7 the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation, the Administrator 8 of the Conservation and Resource Enforcement Division, the Mayor 9 of Honolulu, Mayor of Hawaii, Mayor of Kauai, and the Mayor of 10 Maui.
