## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING A KAPAA QUARRY ROAD SAFETY TASK FORCE TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DEVELOP AND RECOMMEND TRAFFIC SAFETY MEASURES FOR KAPAA QUARRY ROAD IN ORDER TO ALLEVIATE DANGEROUS ROAD CONDITIONS AND REDUCE HAZARDOUS DRIVING PRACTICES.

WHEREAS, Kapaa Quarry Road runs approximately 2.25 miles
 from Kalanianaole Highway to Mokapu Boulevard, on the Windward
 side of Oahu; and

5 WHEREAS, Kapaa Quarry Road runs through Kawai Nui Marsh, a 6 Ramsar Wetland of International Importance, and is a habitat for 7 endemic and endangered birds, making the installation of street 8 lights and widening of the roadways difficult; and

10 WHEREAS, Kapaa Quarry Road has many curves and one deep 11 dip, is unlighted and unimproved, and has no guardrails or lane 12 designations; and

WHEREAS, Kapaa Quarry Road is mainly used by the public to
reach Kapaa Quarry, the Kawainui Model Field (known as "Airplane
Park"), Le Jardin Academy, Kapaa Transfer Station, and
businesses in the industrial park; and

19 WHEREAS, on February 15, 2007, two young women were killed
 20 in a crash while traveling on Kapaa Quarry Road, and five others
 21 were injured; and

WHEREAS, other accidents on Kapaa Quarry Road in recent years include a 1998 crash attributable to speeding, which resulted in the death of a teenage girl; a 2000 incident involving an overturned vehicle, which resulted in the hospitalization of three people, and a 2001 crash that left a teenage boy hospitalized in critical condition; and

30 WHEREAS, although the speed limit on Kapaa Quarry Road is31 twenty-five miles per hour, drivers frequently drive much faster



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and use the road for entertainment, such as going fast over the 1 2 dip to simulate a rollercoaster; and 3 WHEREAS, the State took over the jurisdiction of the Kapaa 4 Quarry from the City and County of Honolulu in 2005, but the 5 Kapaa Quarry Road itself is reportedly owned in portions by four 6 private entities, with the City and County possessing an 7 easement; now, therefore, 8 9 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the 11 House of Representatives concurring, that a Kapaa Quarry Road 12 13 Safety Task Force is established under the Department of Transportation to recommend traffic safety measures for Kapaa 14 Quarry Road; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that members of the Kapaa Quarry 17 Road Safety Task Force include at least one representative from 18 each of the following: the Department of Transportation; the 19 20 Department of Transportation Services of the City and County of Honolulu; the Department of Land and Natural Resources; the 21 22 Honolulu Police Department; the Department of Environmental Services of the City and County of Honolulu; the Kailua 23 24 Neighborhood Board No. 31; the Senate of the State of Hawaii, to be selected by the President of the Senate; the House of 25 Representatives of the State of Hawaii, to be selected by the 26 Speaker of the House of Representatives; and surrounding 27 28 businesses, schools, and property owners, to be determined by the Department of Transportation; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of 31 32 Transportation provide administrative support to the Kapaa Quarry Road Safety Task Force; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Kapaa Quarry Road Safety Task Force report findings and recommendations to the 36 Legislature and the Honolulu City Council no later than twenty 37 38 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 40 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 41 Transportation; the Chair of the Honolulu City Council; the 42 43 Director of Transportation Services of the City and County of Honolulu; the Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 44 2007-2238 SCR SMA-1.doc . 2
