SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO WORK WITH APPROPRIATE ENTITIES TO EXTEND THE LENGTH OF THE SCHOOL DAY TO ACCOMMODATE INCREASED PHYSICAL EDUCATION, ART, AND MUSIC REQUIREMENTS, AND OTHER SPECIAL PROJECTS, WHICH MAY INCLUDE AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES AND COMPETITIONS.

1 WHEREAS, the number of obese children has tripled over the past three decades, posing serious health risks and rapidly 2 rising obesity-related health care costs for ailments such as 3 diabetes, heart disease, stroke, high blood pressure, and 4 asthma; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, Hawaii's adolescent obesity rate has doubled over the past two decades, with twenty-two per cent of boys and girls 8 in Hawaii considered overweight; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, studies have shown that a child who is physically healthy is more likely to be academically motivated, alert, and 12 successful; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, children spend a large part of their lives in school, thus giving schools the opportunity to help them get 16 more physical exercise and provide education on health 17 maintenance; and 18 19 WHEREAS, although high school graduation requirements 20 include one credit of physical education, there is a lack of an 21 adequate and consistent physical education curriculum at the 22 elementary and middle school grade levels; and 23 24 WHEREAS, art and music instruction in the public schools 25 26 has been curtailed or eliminated to focus on academic requirements and standards; and 27 28



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WHEREAS, art instruction promotes an appreciation for 1 society's creative expressions of various art forms and 2 encourages individual creativity; and 3 4 WHEREAS, studies show that music instruction helps with a 5 student's acquisition of logic and math skills; and 6 7 WHEREAS, participation in other school-related special 8 projects, including after school activities and competitions 9 such as those that involve learning the practical applications 10 of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics and other 11 fields of study teach students the value of teamwork, 12 professionalism, and the commitment to problem-solving; and 13 14 WHEREAS, a significant increase in the amount of activity 15 and exercise in a physical education curriculum, art, and music 16 instruction during school hours, and instruction or 17 participation in applied learning activities and competitions 18 19 would require a longer school day; now, therefore, 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 21 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the 22 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 23 Education is respectfully requested to work with the Board of 24 Education, the Governor, and the Hawaii State Teachers 25 Association to consider extending the school day for elementary 26 and middle schools to accommodate increased physical education, 27 art, and music requirements, as well as other after school 28 activities and competitions, which may include those involving 29 applied learning in the fields of science, technology, 30 engineering, and mathematics, to prevent the development of 31 32 adult obesity and to further the well-being and preparation of Hawaii's youth in the future; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the discussion and analysis 35 should encompass the time and resources necessary for 36 participation in after school activities and competitions that 37 provide students applied learning and experiential learning 38 opportunities, including discussion of the necessary staffing 39 and other logistical requirements for those activities and 40 programs; and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 43 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of 44 2007-2073 SCR18 SD1 SMA.doc
