## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

---

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ADOPT POLICIES TO  
PREVENT THE TRANSFER OF INCARCERATED PARENTS OF MINOR  
CHILDREN TO CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES ON THE MAINLAND.

1 WHEREAS, during the 1990s, the number of incarcerated  
2 parents in the United States grew by approximately fifty-nine  
3 per cent; and  
4

5 WHEREAS, currently, there is no means of determining the  
6 exact number of incarcerated individuals with minor children in  
7 Hawaii as no procedure is in place for collecting such data; and  
8

9 WHEREAS, it is estimated, however, that there are  
10 approximately 3,163 parents of 6,665 children in Hawaii's prison  
11 system; and  
12

13 WHEREAS, approximately half of Hawaii's incarcerated felons  
14 are sent to private correctional facilities on the mainland  
15 making it difficult for them to maintain contact with their  
16 families; and  
17

18 WHEREAS, an increased focus needs to be placed on the  
19 children of incarcerated parents to maintain a parent-child  
20 bond; and  
21

22 WHEREAS, studies indicate that the children of incarcerated  
23 individuals suffer from a multitude of negative consequences,  
24 including possible displacement from their home and separation  
25 from their primary or secondary caregiver; and

27 WHEREAS, as a result, these children experience strong  
28 emotional reactions to the incarceration and disruption in their  
29 home life, leading to a significant increase, up to six times  
30 more likely, of becoming involved in the criminal justice system  
31 themselves; and

1 WHEREAS, state policies contribute to the breakdown of the  
2 family by failing to facilitate the continued relationship  
3 between incarcerated individuals and their children when the  
4 relationship is in the best interests of the child; and  
5

6 WHEREAS, denial of visitation is a means of punishment or  
7 discipline of the incarcerated individuals, but those who truly  
8 suffer are the children; and  
9

10 WHEREAS, the strengthening of family relationships has a  
11 positive effect on recidivism as studies have shown it lessens  
12 the possibility of future incarceration after an inmate's  
13 release from a correctional facility; and  
14

15 WHEREAS, studies have also shown that therapeutic  
16 involvement with families during incarceration builds better and  
17 stronger relationships between the incarcerated parent's  
18 children and the incarcerated parent once the parent is  
19 released; now, therefore,  
20

21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth  
22 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the  
23 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of  
24 Public Safety is requested to adopt policies to prevent the  
25 transfer of Hawaii's incarcerated parents of minor children to  
26 correctional facilities on the mainland; and

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety  
29 is strongly encouraged to adopt policies to prevent the transfer  
30 of Hawaii's incarcerated parents of minor children to  
31 correctional facilities on the mainland and that also provide  
32 flexibility for incarcerated parents wishing to stay on the  
33 mainland to stay there; and

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any policies adopted pursuant  
36 to this measure be developed so that they do not result in the  
37 additional triple-bunking of inmates in Hawaii correctional  
38 facilities; and

40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this  
41 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Interim Director of  
42 Public Safety.
