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SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL TO CONVENE A TEMPORARY TASK FORCE TO EXAMINE STRATEGIES, OTHER THAN THOSE HAVING TO DO WITH MEDICAL MALPRACTICE LIABILITY AND INSURANCE PREMIUMS, THAT MAY PREVENT THE EXODUS OF PHYSICIANS FROM THE STATE.

WHEREAS, there has been widespread coverage in the local media that many of Hawaii's physicians, particularly specialists, have chosen to leave the State for various reasons; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature is very much aware of this trend and of the assertions that medical malpractice liability and costly medical malpractice insurance premiums are contributing to this trend; and

WHEREAS, the issue of medical malpractice insurance premiums remains a topic of serious, extensive, and ongoing discussions within the Legislature; and

WHEREAS, however, the Legislature also wishes to uncover and address additional potential reasons for the departure of physicians from the State to fashion a more comprehensive approach to the problem; and

WHEREAS, for example, the State's geographic isolation as the nation's only island state located in the middle of the Pacific Ocean may act as a relative barrier to easy interstate migration of professionals, including physicians; and

WHEREAS, the issue of an alleged monopolistic underwriting structure for reimbursement for physicians in the State has been raised as a problem; and

WHEREAS, the high cost of living in the State affects 1 everyone, including physicians earning relatively higher 2 incomes; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the State to attain a thorough understanding of the issues that may contribute to the 6 exodus of physicians from Hawaii to better fashion a 7 8 comprehensive and effective solution; now, therefore, 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 10 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the 11 House of Representatives concurring, that the Director of Health 12 and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations Workforce 13 Development Council are requested to convene a temporary task 14 force to examine strategies, other than those having to do with 15 medical malpractice liability and insurance premiums, that may 16 prevent the exodus of physicians from the State; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health and the 19 Department of Labor and Industrial Relations Workforce 20 Development Council are requested to include on the temporary 21 task force: 22 23 (1) The Insurance Commissioner; 24 25 (2) The Director of Human Services; 26 27 Physicians; (3) 28 29 (4)A representative from the Department of Commerce and 30 Consumer Affairs' licensing division; 31 32 (5) A representative of the health insurance industry; 33 34 (6)A representative of mutual benefit societies; 35 36 (7) A representative of health maintenance organizations; 37 38 (8) A representative of consumer attorneys; 39 40

A representative of the Hawaii Medical Association;

A representative of the general public; and

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(11) Any other members the Director of Health and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations Workforce Development Council deem advisable; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations Workforce Development Council are requested to convene the task force no later than October 1, 2007, and to terminate the task force on September 30, 2008; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations Workforce Development Council are requested to submit findings and recommendations, including any necessary proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2008; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Directors of Health and Labor and Industrial Relations who, in turn, is requested to notify physicians and representatives of the health insurance industry, mutual benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations, and to the Director of Human Services, the Consumer Lawyers of Hawaii, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations Workforce Development Council, and the Insurance Commissioner.
