SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO RE-EVALUATE THE
MEDICARE FORMULA FOR COMPUTING PAYMENTS TO DOCTORS OR TAKE
OTHER MEASURES TO AVERT FUTURE REDUCTIONS IN PAYMENTS FOR
SERVICES.

1 WHEREAS, approximately forty-three million elderly and
2 disabled individuals are insured by Medicare; and
3

4 WHEREAS, it is estimated that the Medicare program will
5 spend over sixty billion dollars in payments for services
6 provided by doctors and other health care professionals; and
7

8 WHEREAS, a proposed cut of 5.1 per cent in Medicare
9 spending for payments for services provided by doctors was
10 proposed; and
11

12 WHEREAS, Congress deferred the cut, and froze the current
13 rates for payments for services instead; and
14

15 WHEREAS, Congress also established a pay-for-performance
16 system that enables doctors to qualify for a 1.5 per cent bonus
17 if they report data on the quality of their care using measures
18 specified by the federal government; and
19

20 WHEREAS, there has been concern expressed regarding federal
21 agencies setting benchmarks for care; and
22

23 WHEREAS, while Congress has deferred the cut in Medicare
24 spending for payments for services, future payments are unlikely
25 to keep pace with inflation; and

27 WHEREAS, doctors may face even greater cuts in Medicare
28 spending for payments for services next year; now, therefore,

30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth
31 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the



1 House of Representatives concurring, that the United States
2 Congress is requested to re-evaluate the Medicare formula for
3 computing payments to doctors or take other measures to avert
4 future reductions in Medicare spending for payments for
5 services; and

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
8 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of
9 the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House
10 of Representatives, and the members of the Hawaii Congressional
11 Delegation.
