SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO SUPPORT S.57 AND H.R.760, ENTITLED THE FILIPINO VETERANS EQUITY ACT OF 2007.

WHEREAS, on January 4, 2007, Senator Daniel K. Inouye introduced S.57 in the United States Senate, which was referred to the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs, which was referred to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs; and

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2007, United States Representative Filner, on behalf of Representatives Neil Abercrombie and Mazie Hirono, along with other members, introduced H.R.760 in the United States House of Representatives, which was referred to the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs; and

WHEREAS, the short title of S.57 and H.R.760 is the "Filipino Veterans Equity Act of 2007"; and

WHEREAS, S.57 and H.R.760, would amend title 38, United States Code, to deem certain service in the organized military forces of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Philippines and the Philippine Scouts to have been on active service for purposes of benefits under programs administered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs; and

WHEREAS, S.57 and H.R.760, in recognition of the courage and loyalty of the Filipino troops who fought along side America's Armed Forces in the Philippines during World War II would in the final analysis, make health benefits available to more of these qualified Filipino veterans; and

WHEREAS, the Hawaii community, particularly the Hawaii-Filipino community cared for and earnestly supported the Filipino veterans of World War II since their arrival in 1992, triggering an awareness in the community that Filipino veterans

should be recognized for their selfless service to this nation; and should receive veterans' benefits; and
