SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RESTRICTING THE SERVICE OF PRODUCTS CONTAINING ARTIFICIAL TRANS
FATS AT ALL FOOD SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS.

1 WHEREAS, among the goals of the Department of Health are to
2 prevent disease, and promote healthy lifestyles, health, and
3 well-being; and

4
5 WHEREAS, dietary trans fat increases the risk of heart
6 disease; and

7
8 WHEREAS, most dietary trans fat is found in partially
9 hydrogenated vegetable oil; and

10
11 WHEREAS, there are currently available heart healthy
12 alternatives to dietary trans fat, such as non-hydrogenated mono
13 and poly unsaturated vegetable oils, and other, newly developed
14 oils; and

15
16 WHEREAS, when trans fat is replaced with currently
17 available heart healthy alternatives, scientific studies have
18 shown a decrease in coronary heart disease events such as heart
19 attacks by at least six per cent; and

20
21 WHEREAS, national surveys show that Americans spend almost
22 half of their food dollars eating out; and

23
24 WHEREAS, an estimated one third of dietary trans fat comes
25 from foods purchased in restaurants; and

27 WHEREAS, artificial trans fat can be replaced with
28 currently available heart healthy alternatives without consumers
29 noticing an effect; and

31 WHEREAS, the continued presence of artificial trans fat in
32 restaurant foods needlessly increases the risk of heart disease
33 for our States' residents; now, therefore,



1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth
 2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the
 3 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
 4 Health is requested to undertake a study to determine the
 5 feasibility and steps necessary to restrict the use of trans
 6 fats in all foods sold at food service establishments and mobile
 7 food service establishments operating in the State; and
 8

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to
 10 include the determination of relevant definitions, necessary
 11 labeling requirements, reasonable exceptions, appropriate
 12 penalties for violations, and suggested legislation; and
 13

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health is
 15 requested to report to the Legislature with the results of the
 16 study set forth in this Concurrent Resolution no later than
 17 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of
 18 2008; and
 19

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
 21 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health.
