SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ESTABLISH UNIFORM RULES AND PERMITTING PROCEDURES FOR PUBLIC BEACH WEDDINGS.

WHEREAS, Hawaii is home to some of the world's most 1 spectacular beaches; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, these beautiful and serene beaches are becoming popular locations for wedding ceremonies for residents of Hawaii 5 and tourists from all over the world; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a proud history of ensuring public 8 9 access for all to its beaches and shorelines; and 10 WHEREAS, recently, couples planning beach weddings in 11 Hawaii have been receiving inconsistent information on 12 permitting procedures and requirements, often being told that 13 permits are not required; and 14 15 WHEREAS, on several occasions, beach wedding ceremonies 16 have been interrupted by enforcement officials from different 17 divisions of the Department of Land and Natural Resources in an 18 effort to enforce inconsistent permitting procedures; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources has 21 acknowledged that uniform rules need to be adopted to address 22 these inconsistencies; and 23 »• .× 24 25 WHEREAS, chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides the Department of Land and Natural Resources with jurisdiction over 26 public lands, which includes state-controlled beaches and small 27 boat harbors; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the State's primary role in the shoreline area is 30 to preserve and protect coastal resources and support public 31 access along and below the shoreline; and 32 33



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1	WHEREAS, generally, the counties have the primary authority
2	and duty to develop and maintain public access to and along the
3	shorelines; and
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5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, two divisions within the State's Department of Land and Natural Resources, the Conservation and Resource Enforcement Division and the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation, seem to have conflicting rules regarding permit requirements for beach weddings; and
10	WHEREAS, the Conservation and Resource Enforcement
11 12 13 14 15	Division, with full police powers, enforces all state laws and rules involving state lands, state parks, historic sites, forest reserves, aquatic life and wildlife areas, coastal zones, conservation districts, state shores, as well as county
16	ordinances involving county parks; now, therefore,
17	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth
18 19	Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007,
20	that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is requested
21	to establish uniform rules and permitting procedures for
22	weddings on state-controlled beaches and to ensure consistent
23	intra-agency enforcement of the rules; and
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25	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
26 27	Natural Resources is requested to cooperate with the counties in establishing appropriate rules and permits for beach weddings;

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30	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
31	Natural Resources is requested adopt rules and permitting
32 33	procedures that allow for the issuance of annual and daily beach wedding permits, where appropriate; and
33 34	weuding permits, where appropriate, and
35	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
36	Natural Resources is requested to require a beach wedding permit
37	when twenty-five or more chairs are to be set-up on the beach
38	and unattended for thirty minutes or more; and
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40	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
41	Natural Resources submit a report on the actions taken pursuant
42	to this measure to the Legislature no later than twenty days
43	prior to the convening of the 2008 Regular Session; and
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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 2 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Department of Land and Natural Resources, the Administrator of the Division 3 4 of Boating and Ocean Recreation, the Administrator of the 5 Conservation and Resource Enforcement Division, the Mayor of Honolulu, Mayor of Hawaii, Mayor of Kauai, and the Mayor of 6 7 Maui. 8
