SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO DEVELOP AND ADOPT POLICIES THAT ENSURE NOTIFICATION BY ALL HEALTH CARE FACILITIES AND HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS TO THE GOVERNOR-DESIGNATED PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY ENTITY OR AGENCY PRIOR TO TRANSFERRING ANY INDIVIDUAL OUT-OF-STATE TO A TREATMENT, REHABILITATION, OR LONG-TERM CARE FACILITY.

WHEREAS, a serious issue facing our State is the lack of 1 capacity currently in our community to provide adequate care in 2 community-based residential settings; and 3 4 WHEREAS, this is true not only for individuals with 5 disabilities, but for the vast majority of elderly individuals 6 in need of basic medical care or assistance with their 7 activities of daily living; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the lack of capacity will become more exacerbated 10 over time, as our population ages; and 11 12 WHEREAS, one of the unfortunate results of this lack of 13 capacity has been a significant increase in the number of Hawaii 14 residents transferred from hospitals or treatment facilities in 15 Hawaii to facilities on the mainland; and 16 17 WHEREAS, as an island community, we have a responsibility 18 to properly care for our elders and individuals with 19 disabilities; and 20 21 WHEREAS, we need to reverse this trend of sending our local 22 elders and citizens with disabilities to the mainland simply 23 because we lack the facilities to care for them here at home; 24 25 and 26 WHEREAS, we must build, develop, and increase our capacity 27 to care for our people in a way that preserves their dignity and 28 allows them to reside in a community-based setting and receive 29 care appropriate to their needs; and 30 31



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WHEREAS, on a case-by-case basis, individuals who may be 1 subject to a transfer to a mainland facility need to be apprised 2 of their legal rights and need to be able to consult with a 3 suitable advocacy agency to determine whether their rights are 4 being violated or whether their needs are being met; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a governor-designated protection and 7 advocacy system under section 333F-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 8 that is well designed and equipped to perform this function; 9 now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 12 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 13 that the Department of Health is hereby requested to develop and 14 adopt policies that ensure notification by all health care 15 facilities and health care providers to the protection and 16 advocacy entity or agency designated pursuant to section 333F-17 8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, prior to transferring any 18 individual out-of-state to a treatment, rehabilitation, or long-19 term care facility; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, 23 and Director of Human Services. 24 25 26 Mallin 27
