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1 2 WHEREAS, the A+ Program is an important and integral component in helping students achieve their educational goals 3 and reach their potential; and 4 5 WHEREAS, service providers for the A+ Program and other 6 service providers are capable of offering a wide range of 7 academic and extracurricular learning opportunities that support 8 9 and add to the offerings of the schools, especially in subjects and activities that schools are unable to effectively offer 10 because of the No Child Left Behind Act; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, academic services and extracurricular activities offered on school campuses during non-school hours can fill a 14 void for families already searching for opportunities to meet 15 their children's academic needs and interests, as well as offer 16 the convenience of not having to transport children from a 17 18 school to an after-school activity; now, therefore, 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 21 that the Department of Education (DOE) is requested to develop a 22 23 plan to increase academic and extracurricular services to 24 students in the A+ Program and other on-site programs developed and offered by A+ and other service providers; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the non-school hour services 27 include: 28 29 30 (1)Tutoring for specific academic subjects; 31 (2) Training in study skills, such as time management and 32 note-taking; 33 34 35 (3) Training in test-taking skills; 36 Other services in addition to the homework-assistance 37 (4) services, enrichment activities, and supervised 38 recreational activities currently offered by the A+ 39 Program; and 40 41 Other academic offerings, including noncredit classes (5) 42 43 in fine arts, performing arts, foreign language, and physical education and extracurricular activities 44
