## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR TO FUND BREAST CANCER AND CERVICAL CANCER SCREENING FOR LOW-INCOME WOMEN IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, breast cancer is the most common cancer among 1 2 American women, and is second only to lung cancer as a cause of cancer-related deaths; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, cervical cancer is the second most common cancer 6 among women worldwide, and in the United States, about thirteen 7 thousand women are diagnosed with cervical cancer and about five thousand die each year; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, with regular and accurate screening, breast cancer and cervical cancer are highly preventable; and 11 12 WHEREAS, many deaths from breast and cervical cancer will 13 occur disproportionately among women in low-income groups 14 because they are less likely to have access to routine 15 screenings; and 16 17 WHEREAS, many of the breast and cervical cancer deaths 18 among low-income groups could be prevented by making screening 19 services available to all women at risk; and 20 21 WHEREAS, native Hawaiian, Filipino, Micronesian, and other 22 targeted ethnic minority women in Hawaii have higher rates of 23 developing and dying from breast and cervical cancer than the 24 national average; and 25 26 WHEREAS, in 1990, Congress passed the Breast and Cervical 27 Cancer Mortality Act, leading to the creation of cancer 28 screening programs in all fifty states; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Breast and Cervical Cancer Program was 31 established in 1993 through a cooperative agreement with the 32 Centers for Disease Control to provide breast and cervical 33 34 cancer screening services under the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program; and 35 36 SR LRB 07-1966.doc

WHEREAS, the federal funding for this program has leveled 1 and is likely to decrease in the future. Combined with the 2 increased cost of screenings, this will lead to fewer routine 3 4 screenings for women who truly need assistance; now, therefore, 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 6 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 7 that the Governor is requested to establish a program to provide 8 coverage of cancer screening for women fifty to sixty-four years 9 of age who are low-income or have no or insufficient health 10 11 insurance; and 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 13 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and the Director of 14 Human Services. 15 16 17 18
