## SENATE RESOLUTION

---

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO  
COLLABORATE WITH THE ORGAN DONOR CENTER OF HAWAII TO  
INCREASE AWARENESS OF THE BENEFITS OF ORGAN DONATION IN THE  
STATE OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, medical technology has advanced to the point where  
2 lives can be extended beyond what society had envisioned, even  
3 as recently as twenty years ago; and  
4

5 WHEREAS, individuals are given the opportunity to donate  
6 their healthy organs to persons suffering from liver disease,  
7 kidney failure, lung injuries, and corneas for eyes; and  
8

9 WHEREAS, tissues, bone, and other anatomical parts can also  
10 be used by those with injuries that require repair; and  
11

12 WHEREAS, through the miracle of transplantation, many of  
13 our friends, neighbors, and family are now living healthy,  
14 productive lives; and  
15

16 WHEREAS, there are over 94,000 individuals on our nation's  
17 organ transplant waitlist, and unfortunately, less than half of  
18 potential donors will say "yes" to helping others through organ  
19 or tissue donation; and  
20

21 WHEREAS, 6,342 patients were removed from the national  
22 waitlist for organ donation upon reaching their death in 2005;  
23 and  
24

25 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, 375 patients are currently waiting for  
26 life-saving organ transplants according to data provided by the  
27 Organ Procurement and Transplant Network; and  
28

29 WHEREAS, the need for donated organs and tissues continues  
30 as there are thousands of people who would benefit if more  
31 individuals were to become organ and tissue donors; and



1 WHEREAS, to increase the number of available donors,  
2 greater efforts are needed to inform people of the "gift" of  
3 organ and tissue donation and provide them with the opportunity  
4 of to save; and

5  
6 WHEREAS, Hawaii has provided a clear and simple method to  
7 address this concern by allowing individuals to indicate on  
8 their driver's license their willingness to be an organ donor;  
9 and

10  
11 WHEREAS, the Organ Donor Center of Hawaii is the only  
12 federally-designated, private, nonprofit, charitable  
13 organization authorized to recover organs and tissue for  
14 transplant in the State of Hawaii; thus, it should be given  
15 greater assistance from public agencies in furthering this  
16 wonderful initiative on multiple levels; and

17  
18 WHEREAS, organ-donation education programs in high schools  
19 have been proven effective in other states in providing clear  
20 information to students and dispelling false notions they may  
21 have gained based on inaccuracies communicated through the  
22 media; and

23  
24 WHEREAS, the donation of an organ or tissue should not be  
25 cost-prohibitive for those who choose to help; however,  
26 unfortunately many individuals and families undergo financial  
27 and emotional stress in the process of donating an organ or  
28 tissue; and

29  
30 WHEREAS, in 2004, the state of Wisconsin adopted what is  
31 widely known as "Cody's Law," which was created to ease the  
32 financial burden organ or tissue donors bear by providing a tax  
33 credit for expenses brought about through the organ or tissue  
34 donation process; and

35  
36 WHEREAS, taxable income costs of up to \$10,000 incurred by  
37 individuals and families from donating all or part of a liver,  
38 pancreas, kidney, intestine, lung, or bone marrow, and expenses  
39 that include travel, lodging, and lost wages, are eligible for  
40 this credit; and



1 WHEREAS, since its inception, Cody's Law has been adopted  
2 in ten other states and is being considered in more than two  
3 dozen others; and

4  
5 WHEREAS, the Legislature, Department of Education, and  
6 Department of Health are ideally positioned to support the  
7 efforts of those who seek to build an educated and healthy  
8 Hawaii; now, therefore,

9  
10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth  
11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007,  
12 that the Department of Education and Department of Health  
13 collaborate with the Organ Donor Center of Hawaii to increase  
14 awareness of the benefits of organ and tissue donation in the  
15 State of Hawaii; and

16  
17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education,  
18 Department of Health, and the Organ Donor Center of Hawaii  
19 develop programs that:

- 20  
21 (1) Provide clear and factual information to students  
22 to help them make an informed decision about  
23 organ and tissue donation;  
24  
25 (2) Provide a means for encouraging students to  
26 communicate their wishes about organ and tissue  
27 donation to their families; and  
28  
29 (3) Ensure that students who will soon gain their  
30 driver's licenses will be presented with the  
31 opportunity to become organ donors;

35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature supports  
36 living-donor programs such as Cody's Law, which provides  
37 assistance when individuals are in the process of personally  
38 donating organs or tissue to save the lives of the ill; and



1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
2 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Director of  
3 Health, the Superintendent of Education, the Chairperson of the  
4 Board of Education, and the Executive Director of the Organ  
5 Donor Center of Hawaii.
