## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION DIVISION TO RESEARCH AND REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON HOW BEST TO PROTECT HAWAII'S HISTORIC BUILDINGS FROM DEMOLITION.

WHEREAS, throughout Hawaii, there are an unknown number of 1 historically significant buildings that represent an important 2 cultural resource for both residents and visitors to the State; 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, in an increasingly competitive real estate market, 6 7 many of these historic structures face an uncertain future as properties are sold, long-term leases end, and landowners of 8 expensive real estate focus on the "highest and best use" in 9 10 order to reap maximum financial benefits; and 11 WHEREAS, if Hawaii is to retain as many of its historic 12 buildings as possible, additional protection may be necessary in 13 order to provide conditions for demolition and review by state 14 or local preservation commissions; and 15 16 WHEREAS, before additional protection in the form of new 17 laws, rules, or other intervention measures is considered, 18 however, important concepts and principles for historic 19 preservation, the effectiveness of current preservation 20 21 statutes, and strategies for change should be fully researched and developed; now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 24 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 25 that the State Historic Preservation Division of the Department 26 of Land and Natural Resources, with the assistance of Historic 27 Hawai'i Foundation, county governments, and other stakeholders is 28 requested to research and report to the Legislature on how best 29 to protect Hawaii's historic buildings from demolition; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the report is requested to 32 33 include:
