SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONSIDER OFFERING PEACEKEEPING AND PEER MEDIATION CLASSES.

WHEREAS, the creation of peaceful and just societies is a 1 desire of many countries throughout the world; and 2 3 WHEREAS, in places of global conflict and violence, peace 4 5 is a major collaborative goal of many people; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Mahatma Gandhi, a political and spiritual leader who advocated nonviolence, believed that pacifism is not 8 passivity, but is a direct action, well-organized and designed 9 not to bring adversaries to their knees but to their senses; and 10 11 WHEREAS, Colman McCarthy, director of the Center for 12 13 Teaching Peace, who teaches courses on nonviolence at public high schools in the District of Columbia, the University of 14 Maryland, American University, and the Georgetown University Law 15 Center, believes that schools are a critical component of peace 16 17 education and the peace movement; and 18 WHEREAS, Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii, Regular Session of 19 2004, includes in its purpose clause, "Although many 20 responsibilities are laid upon education, ultimately education 21 must do no less than advance the endowment of human culture 22 itself, so that each succeeding generation finds itself further 23 along the road towards peace, social justice, and environmental 24 sustainability in a society guided by creativity, compassion, 25 and curiosity."; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the Legislature believes that Hawaii schools 28 should be teaching ways to achieve peace and, through peer 29 mediation, help students gain the skills necessary to resolve 30 conflict because unless we teach our children peace, someone 31 else will teach them violence; now, therefore, 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 34 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 35 that the Department of Education is requested to consider 36

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offering peacekeeping and peer mediation classes to public high 1 2 school students in Hawaii; and 3

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 5 requested to work with the Board of Education and to collaborate with the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for Peace to develop a 6 7 peacekeeping and peer mediation curriculum; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 9 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Superintendent of 10 Education, the Chairperson of the Board of Education, and the 11 Director of the Spark M. Matsunaga Institute for Peace. 12 13
