SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REPORT ON CURRENT INITIATIVES AND DEVELOP A PLAN FOR FUTURE AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT.

WHEREAS, the No Child Left Behind Act has forced schools to 1 focus their funding and efforts on the lowest achieving students 2 in order to meet the mandates of Adequate Yearly Progress 3 4 required by that Act; and 5 WHEREAS, students who are capable of high academic 6 achievement, become unchallenged or bored and may exhibit 7 behavioral problems in class, and are not reaching their full 8 9 potential; and 10 WHEREAS, many families with highly capable children have 11 chosen to send their children to private schools because of a 12 perceived lack of challenging curricula in public schools; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the gifted and talented programs that do exist in 15 the public schools often serve a very small percentage of highly 16 capable students; and 17 18 WHEREAS, many students deemed "ungualified" for current 19 gifted and talented programs are actually capable of high 20 achievement through "perspiration" and "aspiration"; and 21 22 WHEREAS, open-enrollment gifted and talented programs, 23 similar to programs at Kahuku High School and Kahuku 24 Intermediate School, show that many more students than 25 previously contemplated are capable of meeting the demands of 26 rigorous and challenging curricula; now, therefore, 27 28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 30 that the Department of Education is requested to report on 31 current initiatives that provide for high achieving students and 32 to develop a plan and provide information on the implementation 33 of the plan for future areas of improvement, including 34 35 establishing outcomes, strategies, measures, and timelines, with

the goal of twenty per cent of public school students enrolling 1 in gifted and talented programs, honors classes, advanced 2 placement courses, International Baccalaureate programs, or 3 other similar programs designed to provide rigorous and 4 challenging curricula; and 5 6 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan include but not be limited to the following: 8 9 (1) The number of students currently enrolled in gifted 10 and talented programs or similar programs with highly 11 challenging academic curricula; 12 13 (2) Recommendations on ways to increase the number of 14 enrolled students in gifted and talented programs or 15 similar programs with highly challenging academic 16 curricula, in order to reach the goal of twenty per 17 cent of public school students enrolled in such 18 programs; 19 20 Recommendations on methods to include students in the 21 (3) gifted and talented programs who may not exhibit the 22 traditional qualifications for acceptance into such 23 programs, but who demonstrate a high aptitude for 24 achievement by other performance measures; 25 26 Program recommendations to provide opportunities for (4) 27 potentially high achieving students; 28 29 Program recommendations in the areas of language arts, (5) 30 social studies, math, science, fine arts, performing 31 arts, and foreign languages; and 32 33 (6) The personnel requirements and costs associated with 34 the comprehensive plan; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 37 requested to make information available regarding gifted and 38 talented programs and courses and on current initiatives for 39 high achieving students via the Internet; and 40 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 42 requested to submit its report and plan, including any findings 43
