SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE COLLEGE OF TROPICAL AGRICULTURE AND HUMAN RESOURCES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AND THE HAWAII AGRICULTURE RESEARCH CENTER TO REFRAIN FROM DEVELOPING, TESTING, PROPAGATING, CULTIVATING, RAISING, OR GROWING GENETICALLY MODIFIED TRADITIONAL HAWAIIAN TARO VARIETIES IN THE STATE OR CONDUCTING ANY TYPE OF RESEARCH THAT WOULD SIGNIFICANTLY IMPACT TRADITIONAL HAWAIIAN TARO VARIETIES.

WHEREAS, kalo (colocasia esculenta), the Hawaiian word for 1 taro, is a culturally significant plant to the kanaka maoli, 2 Hawaii's indigenous peoples; and 3 4 WHEREAS, kalo provides the kanaka maoli's life-giving 5 sustenance, poi; and 6 7 WHEREAS, over three hundred kalo varieties may have existed 8 at the time of the arrival of European explorers and today there 9 are approximately seventy varieties of taro and of these, the 10 majority are unique to the Hawaiian islands due to the 11 horticultural skills of native Hawaiian farmers; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the important cultural relationship between kalo 14 and the kanaka maoli continues today in the cultivation of kalo 15 and ohana, the Hawaiian word for family; and 16 17 WHEREAS, kalo expresses the spiritual and physical well-18 being of not only the kanaka maoli and their heritage, but also 19 symbolizes the environmental, social, and cultural values 20 important to the State; now, therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 23 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 24 that the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources at 25 the University of Hawaii and the Hawaii Agriculture Research 26 Center are requested to refrain from developing, testing, 27 propagating, cultivating, raising, or growing genetically 28 modified traditional Hawaiian taro varieties in the State or 29 conducting any type of research that would significantly impact 30 traditional Hawaiian taro varieties; and 31
