SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP OF STAKEHOLDERS TO PROVIDE AN ECONOMIC ANALYSIS OF THE INCENTIVE MEASURES APPROVED FOR IMPORTANT AGRICULTURAL LANDS.

WHEREAS, the passage of Act 183, Session Laws of Hawaii 1 2005 (Act 183), established the process for identifying 2 important agricultural lands as mandated in article XI, section 3 3 of the Hawaii State Constitution; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Act 183 recognized that it is critical not only to 6 establish policies for and to identify important agricultural 7 lands, but also to provide incentives for agricultural viability 8 in Hawaii, particularly for agricultural enterprises that farm 9 important agricultural lands, and for landowners of important 10 agricultural lands; and 11 12 WHEREAS, these incentives should be designed to promote 13 agricultural viability resulting in the long term retention of 14 important agricultural lands; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Act 183 directed the Department of Agriculture, in 17 consultation with the Department of Business, Economic 18 Development, and Tourism and the Department of Taxation, to 19 facilitate a meeting process with stakeholders in the 20 agricultural industry to develop and implement a comprehensive 21 and integrated framework of incentives and programs that will: 22 23 (1) Promote agricultural viability; 24 25 (2) Sustain the growth of the agricultural industry in 26 Hawaii; and 27 28 Develop the long term use and protection of important (3) 29 agricultural lands for agricultural use in Hawaii 30 including tax policies, agricultural business 31 development, and financing, marketing, and 32 agricultural land use techniques; and 33 34

NO. ⁶³ S.D. 1 WHEREAS, furthermore, the Department of Agriculture was requested to submit a report to the Legislature of stakeholder findings and recommendations before the 2007 Regular Session; and WHEREAS, Act 183 also provided a process to map important agricultural lands by the counties, which is then followed by the designation of important agricultural lands, as mapped by the counties, three years after the enactment of legislation establishing incentives and protections for important agricultural lands and agricultural viability; and WHEREAS, Act 183 further recognized that, in addition to state incentives programs, it was equally important to include county incentive programs to provide a comprehensive set of incentives for agriculture to be viable on important agricultural lands; and WHEREAS, the Legislature has deliberated on several of the incentive measures submitted by the Department of Agriculture, the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation, the Land Use Research Foundation, and several other stakeholders in the agricultural industry; and WHEREAS, the Legislature, in consultation with stakeholders in the agricultural industry, will need to evaluate whether the incentive measures approved for important agricultural lands are adequate to begin the designation process; now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, that the Department of Agriculture, in consultation with the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and the Department of Taxation, is requested to reconvene a working group of stakeholders in the agricultural industry in Hawaii; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture is requested to reconvene a working group that consists of the
