## SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, AND THE HAWAII TEACHER STANDARDS BOARD TO PROPOSE EDUCATIONAL MEASURES THAT PROMOTE APPROPRIATE AND DIFFERENTIATED POLICIES AND PRACTICES.

WHEREAS, policies, regulations, and decisions are too often 1 either inflexible and ill-suited to appropriately and 2 effectively meet the requirements of diverse situations and 3 conditions or so broad as to lack focus, clarity, and the means 4 for collaboration and coordination, with either extreme, 5 incapable of best dealing with individual situations of 6 students, teachers, schools, and school complexes; and 7 8 WHEREAS, federally-imposed No Child Left Behind (NCLB) 9 mandates require that all schools be judged upon their adequate 10 yearly progress (AYP) without considering the different 11 challenges and situations each school may face; and 12 13 WHEREAS, NCLB mandates require that all students be judged 14 with single assessments with single benchmarks, regardless of 15 the level of English proficiency, existence of individualized 16 educational plans (IEPs), and other personal and individualized 17 challenges; and 18 19 WHEREAS, many schools and students, especially those of 20 immigrant and economically stressed families, start well below 21 the benchmarks for AYP or proficiency and make significant 22 progress in achievement levels although short of reaching the 23 benchmark for AYP or proficiency; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board awards both new 26 and experienced teachers a single undifferentiated license or 27 renewal without regard to a teacher's longevity, recognized 28 effectiveness, or resume of honors and awards; and 29 30 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Teachers Association, the Hawaii 31 Government Employees Association, the Department of Education, 32 the Board of Education, and the State negotiate teacher and 33



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administrator contracts that designate pay based solely on paper 1 qualifications on years of service, teaching, and advanced 2 degrees and professional development coursework; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the compensation to teachers who are formally 5 recognized for teaching excellence and whose students yearly 6 outperform similar populations of students is not differentiated 7 from other teachers who are moderately effective to seriously 8 ineffective; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Department of Education allows schools wide 11 latitude to select and deliver curriculum so that schools within 12 the same complex may have widely different curricula, textbooks, 13 and other teaching resources and teachers teaching the same 14 course in the same school can use different textbooks, lessons, 15 and assessments; now, therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 18 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 19 that the Department of Education is requested to propose 20 alternative assessments to the present NCLB mandates that more 21 appropriately demonstrate growth in school effectiveness and 22 student achievement and differentiates among the diverse student 23 populations in Hawaii, including those of the most limited 24 English proficiency and those with IEPs; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Teacher Standards 27 Board, with input from the Department of Education and the 28 Hawaii State Teachers Association, is requested to propose 29 differentiated teacher licenses and renewals that recognize 30 teacher effectiveness, longevity, and honors and awards to 31 possibly include the designation of master teacher and emeritus 32 teacher; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education and the 35 Department of Education, in consultation with teachers including 36 authorized representatives of the Hawaii State Teachers 37 Association, are requested to report ways to create a 38 differentiated compensation system or a plan for recognition, 39 promotion, or reward that recognizes highly effective teaching; 40 and 41 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 43 requested to report on how the schools can focus curricular 44 2007-2799 SR69 SD1 SMA-1.doc



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options in core subjects (language, arts, math, and science) to 1 more effectively promote collaboration, professional 2 development, student assessment, coordinated learning 3 activities, and bulk purchasing; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education, 6 7 the Board of Education, and the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board are requested to submit their findings and recommendations, 8 including proposed legislation, to the Legislature not later 9 than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2008 Regular 10 Session; and 11 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chair of the Board of 14 Education, the Superintendent of Education, the Executive 15

16 Director of the Hawaii State Teachers Association, and the

17 Chairperson of the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board.
