SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A COMPARISON STUDY OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AND THE BOARDS OF REGENTS OF SIMILAR STATE UNIVERSITIES ACROSS THE NATION.

WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii (UH) Board of Regents 1 (BOR) manages and controls the general affairs, and has 2 exclusive jurisdiction over the internal structure, management, 3 and operation of UH, and also serves as the State Board for 4 Career and Technical Education; and 5 б WHEREAS, as part of its powers and as prescribed by 7 sections 304A-105 and 304A-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the 8 BOR: 9 10 (1)May purchase or otherwise acquire lands, buildings, 11 appliances, and other property for the purposes of UH, 12 and may expend available funds; 13 14 Shall manage the inventory, equipment, surplus (2) 15 property, and expenditures of UH, and may adopt rules 16 to do so; 17 18 (3) Shall develop internal policies and procedures for the 19 procurement of goods, services, and construction; 20 21 (4) May enter into concession agreements; and 22 23 (5) May receive, manage, and invest moneys or other 24 property that may be given, bequeathed, devised, or 25 otherwise received from sources other than the 26 Legislature or any federal appropriation for the 27 purpose of UH, its improvement or adornment, or the 28 aid or advantage of students or faculty, and in 29 general act as trustee on behalf of UH for these 30 purposes or objects; 31

and 1 2 WHEREAS, currently, the BOR is composed of twelve members, 3 including a student member, who are appointed by the Governor 4 and generally serve four-year terms or until their successors 5 have been appointed and have gualified; 6 7 8 WHEREAS, members of the BOR serve without pay but are entitled to expenses for their travel within the state when 9 attending meetings or engaging in business related to the work 10 of the BOR; and 11 12 WHEREAS, other state universities across the nation also 13 have boards of regents that govern the affairs of their 14 respective institutions and carry out their specific duties 15 according to their own sets of rules and procedures to achieve 16 their defined missions; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, it is wise to take a step back from time to time and evaluate one's organization as part of a larger scheme and 20 in comparison with similar organizations, so that one may gain 21 an awareness of ways in which their own organization can be 22 improved, especially when the organization is constantly under 23 scrutiny by the public eye; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, 27 that the University of Hawaii is requested to perform a 28 comparison study of the Board of Regents of the University of 29 Hawaii and the boards of regents of similar state universities 30 across the nation; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include the following 33 information relating to boards of regents: 34 35 (1) Powers and responsibilities; 36 37 (2)Frequency of board meetings; 38 39 The appointment process of the members; (3) 40
