Madam:

Your Committee on Judiciary and Labor, to which was referred
H.B. No. 1393 entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE UNIFORM INFORMATION
PRACTICES ACT (MODIFIED),"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is protect privacy by authorizing
agencies to withhold from public disclosure individuals' home
addresses in government records concerning contract hires and
consultants and in certified payroll records on public works
contracts.

Your Committee received testimony in support of this measure
from the Office of Information Practices.

Your Committee finds that although home addresses are
generally not required to be disclosed under the personal privacy
exception of the chapter 92F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Uniform
Information Practices Act (Modified), that exception is not
available for certain categories of government documents. This
measure extends to home addresses the same protection currently
provided to individuals' social security numbers in payroll
records on public works contracts and other government records
concerning public hires and consultants.

As affirmed by the record of votes of the members of your
Committee on Judiciary and Labor that is attached to this report,
your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of H.B.
