HB 357 HD1 (HSCR241)	RELATING TO TRAFFIC SAFETY. Establishes a pilot project to test crosswalk safety enhancements and programs in the city and county of Honolulu.	TRN, FIN
HB 806 HD1 (HSCR242)	RELATING TO PEDESTRIAN SAFETY. Appropriates funds to the department of transportation for a joint state and county effort to conduct a pilot study to identify state and county intersections where the time to cross the intersection is insufficient for elderly pedestrians and determine impacts on current traffic volume.	TRN, FIN
HB 351 HD1 (HSCR430)	RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY. Establishes the photo red light imaging detector system program. Authorizes counties to implement the program.	TRN, JUD, FIN
HB 497 HD1 (HSCR243)	RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION. Earmarks 2% of federally eligible moneys from the state highway fund for bikeways.	TRN, FIN
HB 1549 HD2 (HSCR701)	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION. Establishes a multidisciplinary accident investigation team in the police department of each county for the purpose of investigating major accidents on major roadways in a manner designed to minimize lane and roadway closures during the investigation.	TRN, PSM, FIN
HB 155 (HSCR468)	RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION. Requires the Department of Transportation, to the extent practicable, to comply with county outdoor lighting ordinances that are more stringent than other laws and regulations at airports, harbors, and highways.	TRN, FIN

HB 277 (HSCR594)	RELATING TO FEES FOR WINDSHIELD PLACARDS FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Requires the counties to deposit all fees for temporary and replacement disabled parking placards into the general fund.	TRN, FIN
HB 657 (HSCR88)	RELATING TO WAIVER OF ABANDONED VEHICLE PUBLIC AUCTION REQUIREMENTS. Allows the waiver of public auction of a towed vehicle that has not been claimed and the vehicle is missing major components or is so materially damaged as to render the vehicle inoperable and the registration period has expired for the vehicle.	TRN, FIN
HB 1718 HD2 (HSCR522)	RELATING TO CRUISELINE INDUSTRY. Requires the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, in conjunction with certain other agencies, to prepare and submit to the legislature a cost/benefit analysis on the cruise line industry in Hawaii.	TRN, TAC, FIN
HB 1414 (HSCR300)	MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION FOR DEPARTMENT OF TAXATION COUNTY SURCHARGE IMPLEMENTATION COSTS. Authorizes an emergency appropriation (\$4,500,000) for the costs incurred in administering the county surcharge on state general excise tax.	TRN, FIN
HB 30 HD1 (HSCR382)	RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL TRADE AGREEMENTS. Requires legislative consent to bind the State to international trade agreements. Establishes a joint legislative committee to consider international trade agreements when the Legislature is not in session.	INT/EDB, FIN
HB 31 HD1 (HSCR588)	RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT. Prohibits state officials from binding the State to government procurement rules of an international trade agreement without legislative action.	INT/EDB, FIN
HB 1547 HD2 (HSCR589)	RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS. Expands the Office of International Affairs. Establishes a legislative protocol fund. Brings the Second International Symposium on Freeways and Tollways to Hawaii in 2009.	INT, FIN


DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
