SB 56 SD1 (SSCR884)	RELATING TO JURY SERVICE. Allows endodontists, oral surgeons, and periodontists throughout the state and dentists who reside on an island with a population under 500,000 to claim an exemption from jury service. (SD1)	JUD
SB 228 SD1 (SSCR878)	RELATING TO GRAFFITI. Requires minors who commit graffiti to remove their graffiti from the affected property and to perform community service to remove graffiti from other properties. Creates a new penalty for property damage that involves graffiti by requiring the defendant to remove their graffiti from the affected property and to perform community service to remove graffiti from other properties. (SD1)	JUD
SB 755 SD1 (SSCR782)	RELATING TO COUNTY ETHICS COMMISSIONS. Provides standards for the selection of county ethics commission members to ensure their impartiality and independence. (SD1)	JUD
SB 942 (SSCR814)	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Prohibits candidates for public office from appearing in public service announcements from the time of filing nomination papers until the time the person is no longer a candidate.	JUD
SB 945 (SSCR263)	RELATING TO ETHICS. Extends the requirements of financial disclosures to justices and judges.	JUD

SB 1063 SD1 (SSCR657)	RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE VACANCIES. Requires the governor, in filling vacancies in the state senate, state house of representatives, and United States Senate, to select from a list of three prospective appointees nominated by the political party of the prior incumbent; requires prospective appointees to be registered members of nominating political parties at the time of submission of their names to the governor; effective on approval. SB 1068 SD1 (SSCR817)	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN SPENDING. Increases amount that may be spent per voter for state and county elections. (SD1)	JUD, FIN
SB 1334 SD1 (SSCR887)	RELATING TO NAME CHANGES. Prohibits covered offenders subject to registration requirements from petitioning for name changes. (SD1)	JUD
SB 625 SD2 (SSCR677)	RELATING TO COURT INTERPRETERS. Requires the judiciary to certify court interpreters and to appoint and use certified court interpreters in legal proceedings.	JUD, FIN
SB 677 SD2 (SSCR786)	RELATING TO WITNESSES. Amends the reimbursable fees and costs for witnesses in criminal cases. Appropriates funds. (SD2)	JUD, FIN
SB 1113 SD1 (SSCR882)	RELATING TO MISSING PERSONS. Improves the capacity of law enforcement agencies to locate and return missing persons by adopting new procedures and by using technology and databases. (SD1)	JUD, FIN


DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

TESTIMONY MAY ALSO BE FAXED IF LESS THAN 5 PAGES IN LENGTH TO THE HOUSE SGT.-AT-ARMS OFFICE AT: 586-6501 (OAHU) OR 1-800-535-3859 (NEIGHBOR ISLANDS). WHEN FAXING, PLEASE INDICATE TO WHOM THE TESTIMONY IS BEING SUBMITTED, THE DATE AND TIME OF THE HEARING, AND THE REQUIRED NO. OF COPIES THAT IS NEEDED FOR SUBMITTAL.
