SB 1782

RELATING TO PREGNANT WOMEN.

HTH, WAM

Establishes the pregnant women special fund for the purpose of accepting funds to be used to collected data on abortion services, create a program for domestic violence against pregnant women, public education programs, education services for new mothers and mothers-to-be, and equipment. Requires health practitioners licensed in the State providing prenatal care to counsel patients regarding HIV and prenatally diagnosed conditions.

RELATING TO MINORS.

HTH, JDL

Allows a minor who is not under the care, supervision, or control of a parent, custodian, or legal guardian to consent to the provision of primary medical care and services.

SB 1326

RELATING TO DISCLOSURE OF VITAL STATISTICS RECORDS

TO LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS.

S HTH, JDL

Adds law enforcement officers to those who are considered to have a direct and tangible interest in public health statistic records.

SB 1329

RELATING TO THE REVIEW OF HOSPITAL ACQUISITIONS BY

THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

Clarifies that the deadline for the AG to review and either approve or disapprove an application for the acquisition of a hospital is 90 days

after the submission of a complete application.

SB 1346

RELATING TO SENTENCING.

Restores a statutory provision which allows presentence mental or medical examinations of defendants for purposes of sentencing.

SB 1663 RELATING TO PRIVACY OF HEALTH CARE INFORMATION. HTH, JDL Promotes privacy of health care information in civil, criminal, and administrative proceedings by providing for protective orders SB 1802 RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH. HTH, JDL Provides an exception to the confidentiality of mental health records and allows disclosure if it is made by the person's healthcare provider to another health care provider for the purpose of continued care or treatment. SB 1970 RELATING TO SMOKING. HTH, JDL Establishes a Class 15, smoking establishment dispensers'license under the liquor law and allows smoking in the enclosed premises of establishments issued a Class 15 license. Exempts class 15 from restricted smoking areas. SB 1421 RELATING TO CHAPTER 460, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES, HTH, CPH OSTEOPATHY. Makes the application requirements for doctors of osteopathy consistent with those for doctors of medicine. Clarifies the osteopathic residency program, and allows the board to accept national osteopathic exams. Makes the requirements for a limited and temporary DO license consistent with that for a limited and temporary MD License. SB 1674 RELATING TO HEALTH. HTH, CPH Permits a radiologist licensed to practice in another state to provide radiology services by telemedicine while in Hawaii to a patient who is located in the state by which the radiologist is licensed to practice radiology. SB 1749 RELATING TO HYPNOTHERAPY. HTH, CPH Creates new chapter establishing hypnotherapy as a qualified, licensed practice in the State. SB 1805 RELATING TO GENETIC COUNSELORS. HTH, CPH Establishes a licensure program for genetic counselors. SB 753 RELATING TO HEALTH. HTH, WAM Creates Hawaii health authority to develop a comprehensive plan to

RELATING TO RURAL PRIMARY HEALTHCARE AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT IN THE SHORT-TERM. Establishes the UH Statewide Nursing Consortium that will be responsible for the planning, implementation, and evaluation of programs designed to support nursing educational mobility. Creates a specialized emphasis on geriatric nursing within the teaching spectrum. Appropriations for the geriatrics program, funding to operate the consortium, as well as additional funding for the School of Nursing and Dental Hygiene to permit additional students to enroll and

graduate are included.

RELATING TO STEM CELL RESEARCH.

HTH/EDU, WAM

Sets state policy for stem cell research in the State. Requires the University of Hawaii to develop plan to establish an institute for regenerative medicine at school of medicine no later than 12/31/2008.

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOBACCO SETTLEMENT

SPECIAL FUND.

Allows University of Hawaii to use its allotment of moneys from the Hawaii tobacco settlement special fund to pay for operating expenses of the new medical school in addition to paying debt service.

RELATING TO SUN PROTECTION.

HTH/EDU, WAM

Establishes a sun protection program for students in public schools and county sponsored programs, and ensures the use of sun protection programs in group child care homes and group child care centers.
