Appropriates \$6,500,000 as a grant-in-aid to the county of Hawaii for the plans, design, and construction of a Puna district police station. | IGM, WAM |

SB 1602	<p>RELATING TO COUNTIES.</p> <p>Requires any state agency that receives county assistance, services, or permission to use county property, to indemnify the county.</p>	IGM, JDL
SB 1641	<p>RELATING TO COUNTIES.</p> <p>Extends statute of limitation for actions against a county for damage or injury from 6 months to 2 years. SB 1886	<p>RELATING TO VEHICLE REGISTRATION.</p> <p>Requires insurance as a condition of vehicle registration, making it more difficult for a registered vehicle owner to continue to operate an uninsured vehicle in violation of state law.</p>	IGM, CPH


Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
