SB 1053 SD1 (SSCR274)	RELATING TO EMINENT DOMAIN. Prohibits use of power of eminent domain to take and transfer private property to a private entity that had expressed interest in purchasing the same property for development purposes or other private use. (SD1)	IGM, JDL
SB 1279 SD1 (SSCR194)	RELATING TO EMINENT DOMAIN. Allows plaintiff to seek a judicial review of the taking prior to a condemnation action. Requires plaintiff to offer to resell property to defendant for current appraised value or condemnation price plus and cost of environmental remediation or cleanup or other improvements if property taken in eminent domain is not used for the purpose for which it was condemned. SB 1603 SD1 (SSCR420)	RELATING TO LIABILITY. Extend certain sunset dates of provisions that provide state and county governments liability protection for public use of certain state or county recreational areas. (SD1)	WAH/IGM, JDL
SB 1641 (SSCR276)	RELATING TO COUNTIES. Extends statute of limitation for actions against a county for damage or injury from 6 months to 2 years. Permits the counties to identify, by charter, the person to whom claimant should give notice of claim for injuries or damage sustained on public property or as a result of the negligence of county official or employee.	IGM, JDL
SB 1392 SD1 (SSCR345)	RELATING TO ENHANCED PENALTIES FOR SECURITIES VIOLATIONS COMMITTED AGAINST ELDERS. Adds enhanced civil and administrative penalties for securities violations committed against elders. (SD1)	CPH, JDL



SB 1422 (SSCR292)	RELATING SANCTIONS FOR VIOLATIONS BY MORTGAGE BROKERS AND SOLICITORS COMMITTED AGAINST ELDERS. Provides additional sanctions for violations by mortgage brokers and solicitors committed against elders.	CPH, JDL
SB 1723 (SSCR309)	RELATING TO HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS. Makes a technical amendment to the scope of relief provided to native Hawaiians under Hawaiian home lands individual trust claims law.	WAH, JDL
SB 1636 SD1 (SSCR534)	RELATING TO SUBSTANCE ABUSE. Amends definition of "substance abuse on-site screening test" to include tests used for forensic testing as a workplace testing device. Requires that substance abuse testing be conducted according to the manufacturer's package insert, as an alternative to the Food and Drug Administration insert if there is no FDA insert. (SD1)	HTH, JDL
