
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In 2001, the twenty-first legislature of the
2 State of Hawaii transferred the responsibility for licensing
3 teachers from the department of education to the Hawaii teacher
4 standards board. This was based on the recommendations made by
5 the Hawaii Policy Group of the National Commission on Teaching
6 and America's Future, a national organization with twenty-three
7 partner states, including Hawaii. By authorizing the Hawaii
8 teacher standards board to assume responsibility for teacher
9 licensing, the legislature sought to strengthen the teaching
10 profession by making it self-governing and accountable for who
11 becomes and remains licensed to teach in Hawaii. Like its
12 professional counterparts, the board of medical examiners for
13 doctors and the Hawaii state bar association for lawyers, the
14 Hawaii teacher standards board was authorized to issue, renew,
15 revoke, suspend, and reinstate licenses for individuals desiring
16 to teach in our State.

17 Over the past four years, the Hawaii teacher standards
18 board has carried out its licensing responsibilities as



1 described by law and, in doing so, has learned that powers and
2 duties that appeared to be enumerated in statute now seem to
3 require clarification. Specifically, the power to suspend its
4 policies, rules, and standards needs to be further described.
5 Allowing this to occur, in accordance with chapter 92, Hawaii
6 Revised Statutes, will help to expedite the Hawaii teacher
7 standards board's ability to perform its duties.

8 The purpose of this Act is to:

- 9 (1) Authorize the Hawaii teacher standards board to
10 suspend its policies, rules, and standards when
11 extenuating circumstances require it to do so; and
12 (2) Enable the Hawaii teacher standards board to amend
13 certain fees and set or amend other charges related to
14 the performance of its duties;

15 provided that these actions shall be in accordance with chapter
16 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

17 SECTION 2. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18 amended to read as follows:

19 "**§302A-803 Powers and duties of the board.** (a) In
20 addition to establishing standards for the issuance and renewal
21 of licenses and any other powers and duties authorized by law,
22 the board's powers shall also include:



- 1 (1) Setting and administering its own budget;
- 2 (2) Adopting, amending, or repealing[, ~~or suspending the~~
3 ~~policies, standards, or~~] the rules of the board in
4 accordance with chapter 91;
- 5 (3) Receiving grants or donations from private
6 foundations, and state and federal funds;
- 7 (4) Submitting an annual report to the governor and the
8 legislature on the board's operations and from the
9 2007-2008 school year, submitting a summary report
10 every five years of the board's accomplishment of
11 objectives, efforts to improve or maintain teacher
12 quality, and efforts to keep its operations responsive
13 and efficient;
- 14 (5) Conducting a cyclical review of standards and
15 suggesting revisions for their improvement;
- 16 (6) Establishing licensing fees in accordance with chapter
17 91, including the collection of fees by means of
18 mandatory payroll deductions, which shall subsequently
19 be deposited into the state treasury and credited to
20 the Hawaii teacher standards board special fund;
- 21 (7) Establishing penalties in accordance with chapter 91;



- 1 (8) Issuing, renewing, revoking, suspending, and
2 reinstating licenses;
- 3 (9) Reviewing reports from the department on individuals
4 hired on an emergency basis;
- 5 (10) Applying licensing standards on a case-by-case basis
6 and conducting licensing evaluations;
- 7 (11) Preparing and disseminating teacher licensing
8 information to schools and operational personnel;
- 9 (12) Approving teacher preparation programs;
- 10 (13) Administering reciprocity agreements with other states
11 relative to licensing;
- 12 (14) Conducting research and development on teacher
13 licensure systems, beginning teacher programs, the
14 assessment of teaching skills, and other related
15 topics;
- 16 (15) Participating in efforts relating to teacher quality
17 issues, conducting professional development related to
18 the board's standards, and promotion of high teacher
19 standards and accomplished teaching; and
- 20 (16) Adopting applicable rules and procedures.

21 (b) If, in accordance with chapter 92, the board
22 determines that extenuating circumstances exist, the board may



1 temporarily suspend its rules, or any portion thereof. The
2 board shall establish, in accordance with chapter 91, procedures
3 for the suspension of its rules. When determining whether to
4 suspend its rules, the board shall also establish the length of
5 time for which the suspension shall be in effect.

6 (c) The board, in accordance with chapter 92, may also
7 amend licensing-related fees and set or amend other charges
8 related to the performance of its duties."

9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;
12 provided that on July 1, 2009, section 2 of this Act shall be
13 repealed and section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
14 reenacted in the form in which it read on June 30, 2007.
