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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPACT FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-410, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]§103D-410[+] **Energy efficiency through life-cycle**  
4 **costing.** (a) The procurement practices of the State shall  
5 include energy efficient standards and policies, including life-  
6 cycle costing.

7 (b) In implementing life-cycle costing, the purchasing  
8 agency shall be guided by energy efficiency standards and  
9 policies for purchasing various items developed and promulgated  
10 by the United States Department of Energy and other federal  
11 agencies, and nationally recognized trade associations,  
12 including but not limited to the National Association of State  
13 Purchasing Officials, the National Institute of Governmental  
14 Purchasing, Inc., the National Association of Purchasing  
15 Management, and the Air Conditioning and Refrigeration  
16 Institute. The purchasing agency shall notify bidders of  
17 information, procedures, and forms required in implementing  
18 energy efficiency standards and policies. The information



1 required shall include purchasing standards and policies  
2 developed by federal agencies and by nationally recognized  
3 agencies and associations, as well as energy consumption and  
4 life-cycle cost data.

5 (c) The purchasing agency shall consider purchasing via  
6 the life-cycle costing method those classes of items for which  
7 nationally recognized energy efficiency data have been  
8 developed. These items shall include but not be limited to  
9 automobiles and air conditioning systems. The watt-saving  
10 variety of common-sized fluorescent lamps shall be purchased  
11 except where standard wattage of those lamps is specifically  
12 required by the using agency.

13 (d) By January 1, 2010, notwithstanding the provisions of  
14 any other law to the contrary, all state agencies shall replace  
15 any incandescent light bulbs in use in any state government  
16 facility with ENERGY STAR qualified compact fluorescent light  
17 bulbs. The purchasing agency shall replace, whenever possible,  
18 all incandescent light bulbs used in buildings owned by the  
19 State with compact fluorescent light bulbs."

20 SECTION 2. Within thirty days after the enactment of this  
21 Act, the director of business, economic development, and  
22 tourism, as energy resources coordinator, shall undertake a



1 public education and awareness campaign to inform businesses and  
 2 individual consumers of the benefits of using ENERGY STAR  
 3 qualified compact fluorescent light bulbs. In conducting this  
 4 public education campaign, the director shall utilize both  
 5 electronic and print media and any other methods deemed  
 6 appropriate.

7 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
