2 management division; and

3 (D) The public utilities commission; and

4 (2) Two representatives from each local utilities
5 coordinating council.

6 (c) The utilities coordinating council shall be placed
7 within the department of transportation for administrative
8 purposes.

9 (d) Members of the utilities coordinating council shall:

10 (1) Serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
11 reasonable expenses, including travel expenses,
12 necessary for the performance of their duties; and

13 (2) Elect a chairperson from the membership.

14 **§ -2 Utilities coordinating council; responsibilities.**

15 (a) The utilities coordinating council shall:

16 (1) Identify national best practices for utility
17 coordination;

18 (2) Develop and implement a project development process to
19 coordinate the orderly planning and installation,
20 removal, or relocation of underground facilities;

21 (3) Meet at least quarterly at various locations
22 throughout the State;



1 (4) Assist and promote the formation of local utility
2 coordinating councils;

3 (5) Encourage agencies, utilities, contractors, and
4 excavators, not already members, who are in any way
5 involved in subsurface disturbance to attend local
6 utility coordinating councils meetings; and

7 (6) Improve dialogue among those involved in subsurface
8 disturbance, including agencies, utilities,
9 contractors, and excavators.

10 (b) The utilities coordinating council shall submit an
11 annual report to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
12 to the convening of each regular session.

13 § -3 **Local utilities coordinating councils.** (a) Local
14 utilities coordinating councils may be formed in each county and
15 consist of representatives of:

16 (1) The various county agencies involved in subsurface
17 disturbance, including agencies related to
18 maintenance, public works, planning, and permitting;

19 (2) The gas utility industry;

20 (3) The electric utility industry;

21 (4) The telecommunications utility industry;

22 (5) The pipeline operator industry;



- 1 (6) The cable service industry;
- 2 (7) The General Contractor Association of Hawaii; and
- 3 (8) The Building Industry Association of Hawaii.
- 4 (b) Members of each local utilities coordinating council

5 shall:

- 6 (1) Serve without compensation; and
- 7 (2) Elect two representatives from the membership to serve
- 8 on the state utilities coordinating council.

9 § -4 **Project development process.** (a) All public

10 utilities in the State shall comply with the project development
11 process.

12 (b) The project development process shall:

- 13 (1) Emphasize early utility identification and
- 14 coordination, including greater utility coordination
- 15 in the design phase;
- 16 (2) Seek to resolve any utility coordination issues before
- 17 construction begins;
- 18 (3) Minimize project delays, construction costs, and
- 19 contractor claims that are associated with subsurface
- 20 disturbance;
- 21 (4) Clarify roles and responsibilities;
- 22 (5) Provide consist application of procedures; and



1 (6) Solicit feedback.

2 (c) As used in this section, "public utility" has the same
3 meaning as that term is defined under section 269-1."

4 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
