
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 201-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[\+]§201-17[\+] **Office of international affairs;**

4 **established.** (a) There is established, within the department
5 of business, economic development, and tourism, an office of
6 international affairs.

7 (b) The office shall:

8 (1) Develop policies that promote and strengthen relations
9 with other countries in the areas of international
10 business, economy, culture, and the arts;

11 (2) Develop policies that promote transportation between,
12 and tourism with, other countries;

13 (3) Develop and promote international telecommunications
14 and high technology exchanges;

15 (4) Encourage the development of international sister-city
16 programs, pairing Hawaii cities with cities around the
17 globe for artistic, cultural, economic, educational,
18 and faith-based exchanges;



- 1 (5) Develop and promote Hawaii as the economic, trade,
2 commerce, transportation, banking, and tourism hub of
3 the Pacific;
- 4 (6) Develop an international affairs and peace education
5 curriculum that includes studies of international
6 affairs and peace initiatives and takes a proactive,
7 strategic approach to the development of policies that
8 promote the prevention of national and international
9 conflict, nonviolent intervention, mediation, peaceful
10 resolution of conflict, and structured mediation of
11 conflict; [~~and~~]
- 12 (7) Provide for exchanges of individuals between Hawaii
13 and other nations to develop international and peace-
14 based initiatives[~~-~~];
- 15 (8) Support the activities of the peace mission committee
16 pursuant to subsection (d); and
- 17 (9) Support the activities commemorating Peace Day
18 pursuant to section 8-16.
- 19 (c) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if any
20 of the responsibilities or duties of the office of international
21 affairs under this section overlap with the responsibilities or
22 duties of another agency or authority under this chapter, the



1 office of international affairs shall have exclusive
2 jurisdiction and authority over those responsibilities and
3 duties.

4 (d) There is established a committee to be known as the
5 peace mission committee, which shall be placed within the office
6 of international relations for administrative purposes. The
7 purpose of the peace mission committee shall be to plan and
8 develop:

9 (1) Peace missions to other nations and international
10 organizations, particularly with nations and
11 organizations that are engaged in conflict with the
12 United States;

13 (2) Cultural exchange and goodwill programs with other
14 nations' education, business, and community sectors;
15 and

16 (3) Charitable donation programs with other nations,
17 provided that the programs do not violate any treaties
18 or international policies involving the United States.

19 The committee shall be a permanent body within the
20 department of business, economic development, and tourism. The
21 committee shall consist of seven members who shall be appointed,
22 without regard to section 26-34.



1 The committee members may include members from the private,
2 public, community at large, and academic sectors. The speaker
3 of the house of representatives shall select two members. The
4 president of the senate shall select two members. The governor
5 shall select three members.

6 The members shall not receive compensation for their
7 services but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses,
8 including travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their
9 duties under this subsection. Any member of the committee shall
10 be immune from civil liability, as provided for under section
11 26-35.5.

12 In its efforts to conduct peace missions, initiate cultural
13 exchange and goodwill programs, and develop charitable donation
14 programs with other nations and international organizations, the
15 committee may seek grants from public and private sources and
16 may accept donations to finance its projects, programs, and
17 activities. The director of business, economic development, and
18 tourism may direct any or as many employees the director deems
19 appropriate to staff the committee.

20 The committee shall submit a written report of its
21 activities on an annual basis to the legislature no later than



1 twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session,
2 beginning with the regular session of 2009."

3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to be used
6 by the peace mission committee for the purposes of this Act.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
9 this Act.

10 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

12 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008.
