A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIRES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that development in the			
2	outlying fringe of metropolitan areas and in rural areas is			
3	increasing the size of the wildland-urban interface, the area			
4	where structures and other human development meet or intermingle			
5	with undeveloped wildland. The expansion of the wildland-urban			
6	interface in recent decades has significant implications for			
7	wildfire management and impact. A growing wildland-urban			
8	interface creates an environment in which fire can move readily			
9	between structural and vegetation fuels, and it increases the			
10	likelihood that wildfires will threaten structures and people.			
11	A collaborative effort is necessary to involve builders,			
12	homeowners, insurers, mortgage brokers, landscapers, fire			
13	service, community leaders, planners, developers, local and			
14	state agencies, and others in the effort to protect people,			
15	property, and natural resources from the risk of wildland fire			
16	before a fire starts. This approach emphasizes community			
17	responsibility for planning in the design of a safe community as			
18	well as effective emergency response, and individual			



1	responsibility for safer home construction and design,		
	responsibility for safer nome construction and design,		
2	landscaping, and maintenance.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to establish the wildland-urban		
4	interface program in the division of forestry and wildlife,		
5	department of land and natural resources, to address the growing		
6	fire danger in wildland-urban interface areas.		
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 185, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately		
9	designated and to read as follows:		
10	"§185- Wildland-urban interface program. (a) There is		
11	established the wildland-urban interface program in the		
12	department. The administrator of the forestry and wildlife		
13	division shall administer this program.		
14	(b) The duties of the program may include:		
15	(1) Assisting and supporting wildland-urban interface		
16	communities by providing technical expertise in		
17	wildland-urban interface, GIS risk mapping, guidelines		
18	for creating risk mitigation ordinances, and community		
19	grant program participation requirements;		
20	(2) Developing a public outreach plan to include printed		

material and a wildland-urban interface web site with

information on creating defensible space and reducing

1		wildfire risk, as well as conducting community
2		meetings for public education;
3	(3)	Providing wildland-urban interface communities with a
4		generalized risk assessment, maps, and data describing
5		a community's general wildland fuels and fire risks;

7	(4)	Providing wildland-urban interface communities with
8		specific assessment technology for use in the detailed
9		community assessment work.
10	<u>§185</u>	- Wildland-urban interface special fund. (a) There
11	is establ	ished in the state treasury the wildland-urban
12	interface	special fund, into which shall be deposited:
13	(1)	Grant moneys or other contributions from federal,
14		state, or county government sources or private
15		entities to support operations of the wildland-urban
16		interface program; and
17	(2)	Appropriations made by the legislature to the
18		wildland-urban interface special fund.
19	(b)	The wildland-urban interface special fund shall be
20	administe	red by the department of land and natural resources'
